BURNS MANUSCRIPTS WILL GO TO SCOTLAND

Philadelphia, December 1.—The mystery surrounding the whereabouts of the Gleneliff manuscripts of the poet Burns, which were sent to the Athenaeum library of Liverpool last summer, was cleared up here tonight when John Gribbel, vice president of the Philadelphia Ledger, and associate editor of the Philadelphia Ledger, announced that the two volumes were removed from a fireproof safe. Mr. Gribbel made the announcement at a meeting of the Burns Society. He declared that he had purchased the manuscripts from a dealer in Scotland, where they were stored until they were removed from a fireproof safe and laid before the press.

Mr. Gribbel recounted how Burns, between 1788 and 1791, prepared a manuscript volume containing his best poems, which he wanted them known to posterity and also a volume containing his manuscript letters. He also told how Burns presented his letters to the Glasgow Athenaeum in 1810, and how his widow returned them to Burns in 1812. He explained that the Glasgow Athenaeum had been destroyed by fire in 1812, and that the manuscripts were hidden in a hiding place in Scotland. He also mentioned that the manuscripts were discovered by a dealer in Philadelphia and submitted to Mr. Gribbel, who purchased them for \$6,000.

Mr. Gribbel explained that he has a copy of the manuscripts and that he is planning to publish them. He also mentioned that he is planning to publish a book about Burns and his manuscripts.
