GORE AND HIS WIFE ARE SCORED TO JURY

Attorneys Are Summing Up and Case Will Be Submitted Today—Woman's Attorney Accuses Gore of Lying.

Oklahoma City, Okla., February 12.—Six of the twelve hours allotted for argument in the damage suit brought by Mrs. Minnie D. Bond, of Oklahoma City, against United States Senator Thomas F. Gore had been consumed when court adjourned today, and unless some unforeseen contingency intervenes, the case will be submitted to the jury late tomorrow.

Summing up began after Judge Giddings had called the case to the attention of the jury. Mrs. Bond's attorney, J. M. Giddings, declared that the senator had committed a crime a criminal act in itself.

He described Mrs. Bond as a "plain woman," the daughter of a simple farmer, and challenged counsel for Senator Gore to show from the records where this woman had been turned aside from the path of virtue.

Turning from the jury and pointing to Mrs. Bond and to Mrs. Bond, Giddings testified: "Look at these two women and note the difference in the dress of each. In her garments, the other is a plain woman, the daughter of a simple farmer.
