Binghamton, N. Y., July 22.-Fift Binghamton, N. Y., July 22.—Fifty persons were killed, according to late estimates, and as many injured, a dozen or more fatally, in a fire which swept the four-story factory building of the Binghamton Clothing company this afternoon. The victims were chiefly women and girls.

Early tonight twenty-two bodies had been recovered. In the city hospital and in private institutions are sharing injured. Some two score per-sons are known to have escaped, as if by a miracle, from the building, which burst into flame like a tinderbox and became a roaring furnace alest in no time after the first alarm

About 125 persons were in the fac-ory when the fire broke out. Those unaccounted for, or most of them, are relieved to be still in the red-hot ruins of the structure.

THE TRACK CLEARED.

Georgians who know the historic im-portance of the issues to be settled by the present legislature were yesterday given distinct encouragement. Already the legis-lature has vindicated itself as a body with the capacity and willingness to do things and do them on schedule time. Several days ago Chairman Crawford Wheatley, of the appropriations committee, brought the appropriations bill into the house, which yesterday begun consideration of that measure, rec ords for speed being established in both instances. Yesterday Chairman L. R. Akin, Instances. Yesterday Chairman L. R. Akin, of the ways and means committee, reported what is undoubtedly the most important measure of the session in the bill designed to effect tax revision. His committee will shortly report the seneral bicanial tax bill. The businessilke celerity shown in these instances is indication of the temper of the house, and the fact that its haders appreciate the urgency of the situation.

There is now every prospect that the appropriations bill will go to Governor Slaton, as he requested, ten days before adjournment, so that he may have full time for its consideration. If it falls to do so it will

consideration. If it fails to do so it will not be the fault of Speaker Burwell, who has consistently expedited business, of Chairman Wheatley and of the members of

Chairman Wheatley and of the members of his committee.

It is especially gratifying that such progress has been made on the measure for tax revision. The diplommey of Chairman Akin and the patriotism of the committee members have effected a soed working compromise. A few days ago the committee seemed hopelessly spil over the question of a state board of equaliters. The bill brought in yesterday at least recognizes the principle of a state board and should furnish an excellent basis. further necessition and procress. It should be understood that the state board will not deal with the matter of individual equalizations. That is left to the counties. When the counties send in their returns then the state board passes upon them as a whole, as between county and county, holdings the balance true, and providing the necessary equilibrium. INOCCUATION OR SANITATION.
The Springfield (Mass.) Republican very properly refuses to credit to annitation the fart that there have been only neglished declars from typholif ever among the 12,000 Annerican troops quartered for five months on the Mexican broder. It holds that inoculation has had at least something to do with the immunity of the army from a scourse that used to be all-prevalent and deadly.

scourse that used to be all-prevalent and deadly.

The proof of the case in behalf of inoculation is tolerably clear. For several years now inoculation against typhoid fever has been compulsory with all army recruits. These latter have been exposed to all manner of danger, and often it has been impossible to keep sanitation at a desirable standard. Yet the rate from typhoid has been insignificant. Even where men who had been inoculated developed the disease it was of an extremely mild type and quickly rau a comparatively harmless course.

We seem therefore to be instituted in

quickly ran a comparatively harmless course.

We seem, therefore, to be justified in believing that in incoulation we have discovered almost as sure a way of handling typhoid as serening in malaria and yellow fever. It has not yet been established that inoculation will be of benefit after the patient has developed the disease. Its proven virtues are almost solely in the line of prevention. But considering the relative trivit, ality of the operation of thousands assainst the former huse toil of typhoid, the preventive advantage of the vaccine more than justifies itself.

This does not mean, of course, that there should be any letup in the crusade for efficiency.

This does not mean, of course, that there should be any let-up in the crusade for efficient sanitation. Sanitation of the right type is protection against diseases which no amount of inoculation will reach, and that is not to speak of its efficacy from the point of view of mere cleanliness. If, for instance, inoculation against typhold were made compulsory throughout the United States, and sanitation neglected, we would only combat the death at one point—typhold fever. At others it would rise higher than ever. The triumph of selence with regard to typhold, however, gives hope that preventive treatment other than sanitation may ultimately be found for many diseases against which medicine is now helpiess. Considering the marvelous progress of the past half decade, even, the outflook is of the most encouraging description.

Chaingangs in Georgia

Last Thursday night a man slept chained to others.

And doing this at the bottom of a funnel-shaped pit of stone into which the sun's rays pour and beat, enveloping in wave on wave of agonizing heat the suffering striped and shackled working men!

Friday each minute the heat grew worse.

The atmosphere quivered with it.

The quarry became a pit of torment.

From its depths, to his keeper, the man cried:

"I am sick."

The guard replied:

"You didn't say so this morning."

Later the man fell fainting at his work.

Stripe-clad, shackled men lifted him tenderly.

They carried him out.

Through the woods a jolting, springless wagon bore the dying man ${\bf to}$ the convict camp, where he died.

The man had not been condemned to death.

He was only a misdemeanor convict.

The utmost punishment provided by your law for him was twelve months in the chaingang, six months in jail and a fine of one thousand dollars.

And you had no wish to kill him.
