Following Marriage in Atlanta Couple Disappears and Friends Have Not Been Able to Locate Them

WOMAN CLAIMED TO BE
SISTER OF SENATOR LEA

Announcement of Wedding Caused Investigation by Tennessee Papers—Mrs. Newman Formerly an Actress.

Memphis, Tenn., November 19.—(Special)—Investigation unparaleled, followed by a remarkable disappearance, is the story in brief of the romance of C. D. Newman, a prominent business man, by a woman of mystery, the wife of J. T. Tarr, a copartner, but also the wedding of Newman and perhaps of predecessors.

Memphis friends of Newman and his wife think that Newman and his bride are at the St. Charles hotel in New Orleans, although messages to him at that place have not been answered. According to the story told, he met his wife at a Memphis hotel under the name of Miss Marjorie Lee, and that she was a sister of United States Senator Lea. The woman sought Newman's advice about disposing of property she claimed to own in Memphis. He became infatuated with her and they were married in Atlanta last Wednesday.

Tarr's Wife Disappears. The day before the marriage Tarr's wife disappeared and the matter was referred to the police. When Tarr was a denial in Memphis papers that the woman who married Newman was Senator Lea's sister, he was arrested in Memphis and taken to a company, of which Newman is proprietor, to secure information. Photographs shown him as Newman's bride as that of his own wife.

Mrs. Newman was formerly an actress, and her relatives had heard nothing of her since her marriage to Tarr in New Mexico two years ago. He says he married the woman in New Mexico, where he met her in a cafe. After that they lived in different cities, always under different names—the woman claiming her relatives were "after her."

It became known that the woman was not the sister of Senator Lea, an investigation followed. The Newman were married in Atlanta by Rev. H. M. DuBois at the First Methodist parsonage last Wednesday. The couple were attended by Lindsey Hopkins, who knew Newman for years, the men having been college friends.

Following the ceremony here Newman talked to a Committee reporter at the Piedmont hotel, where it was noted the couple had met by appointment earlier in the day for the marriage. Newman declared it was his bride's wish that nothing save a bare announcement of the publication of the facts that Mrs. Newman said she was a sister of Senator Lea of Tennessee. Newman and his wife made public and Newman at last consented to the publication of the facts. In fact, Mrs. Newman also said through a friend that she was sister-in-law to a senator from New Mexico.

Atlanta people who know the Lea family well scoffed at the report. Senator Lea's sister had been quietly married. The Tennessee papers also made much of the marriage. Newman started an investigation as to the bride's real name.

The couple left the Piedmont Thursday afternoon following their marriage. The wife was wearing a diamond bracelet and address at that hotel is not registered.
