Murphy, Collins and Baker between them made nine of the twelve errors of the Philadelphia club, and these nine hits scored 7 of the 8 runs that made the victory one-sided. The eighth run was a terrific home run by Schang. He sailed over the outfield fence, and the Athletics on First Mack's hitting list.

The victors of this vigorous contest secured with the bat. Not a single National League representative failed to get a hit, and the Athletics scored two hits and a sharp double was the only one good for more than one base.

ROTATION URGED TO ENRICH LAND

Farm Demonstration Workers, in Three Days' Session, Discuss Plans to Improve Agriculture.

Special stress was laid on the importance of crop rotation at the first day's meeting of the north Georgia agents of the Farmers' Co-operative Demonstration which began a three days' session in the chamber of the state senate at the capital yesterday.

The demonstration work is under the direction of the United States department of agriculture and the State college of agriculture, with State Agent J. Phil Campbell, of Athens, in charge.

There are twenty-three agents in the northern part of the state in twenty-seven counties.

Another feature upon which stress was laid is to plant winter wheat, oats, clovers and other winter legumes this fall. Not only is the planting of more foodstuffs urged in order to prepare the farmers for the advent of the boll weevil, but also in order to enable them to be independent of other markets.

Then it was shown by a number of examples, cited by the demonstrators themselves, that the productive power of the land had been greatly increased by crop diversification. Cattle, hogs, swine, turkeys, and other animals were bred, and that crop rotation was the only means that had improved the land from impoverishment.

In order to bring the work that is being done by the college in connection with the United States department as near to the farmer as possible, State Agent Campbell urged upon the demonstrators the importance of holding "old field schools" in every community in the counties in which they are working. It was pointed out that more can be achieved by this direct method of instruction in improving the productiveness of the land and the conditions of farm life than by any other method.

It was also urged that demonstrators secure the cooperation of the local merchants in their efforts to improve methods of farming. In this connection, Professor Campbell, one of the state supervisors of the department, urged that the demonstrators talk on the cooperation of the demonstrators with the work done during the past year. The last two days' sessions will be devoted to discussing the methods to be done, and outlining the work during the coming year.

6 ALLEGED MOONSHINERS UNDER HEAVY BONDS

Barbarous Conditions Exist In Negro Schools of Atlanta

By Emma Dooley. As many as 1,000 negro children of school age were around the streets of Atlanta today because there is no room in the public schools for them.

As many as 5,000 negro children have only three hours a day schooling, whereby one-half of the children who can get seats go to school in the morning and the other half in the afternoon.

The same teacher who teaches sixty children in the morning until 12 o'clock teaches fifty more, and teaches until 4 in the afternoon. How can she do this in the Pittsburgh school for neglected children, the school composed of three old shanty buildings—a fire broke out in the annex. There was the usual drill, the 100 men came and put out the fire and the school was closed.

Georgia Must Advertise Wealth of Her Acres

By F. M. Patton. Having just returned from an extended trip in the middle west in the interest of my company, which is sales agent for the J. A. J. Henderson subdivision of farms at Ocala, Ga., I noticed a situation which should be of interest to Georgians and the south generally.

In the north and middle west, good farms are selling at prices that are not only profitable to the farmer, but also to the investor. It is a long and uphill job for them to accumulate a herd of lands, and then, when they have accumulated a satisfactory acreage of good lands and thousands of them are consequently selling at high prices, they are able to sell them at a profit.

A queer situation is that in one part of that section a constant stream of farmers are moving to another part because while lands in their section are from \$10 to \$200 per acre, in the other for \$10 to \$100, this means that they can get the same amount of land for half the price. This is not a new thing, but it is a new thing in that it is now being done in the south.
