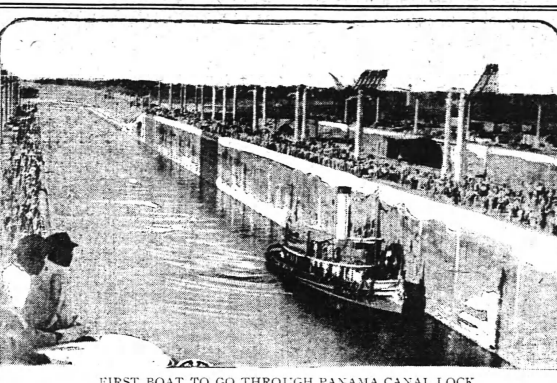

Mexico City, October 15.—The diplomatic representatives of Great Britain, France, Spain, Cuba, Guatemala and Norway, at a conference, decided to recommend that their respective governments send warships to Mexico for the purpose of affording protection to their citizens and to their legations.

Mr. Aldrich's speech was delivered at the opening session of the national conference on currency reform. He made no reference to the so-called Aldrich bill, but rather to the money measure of the Glass-Steagall bill, which he criticized as the provision dealing with the issue of government bonds and providing for a central government bank with supervision over the system as a whole.

Passage of Gen. Maas Across American Soil Said to Be Related to Army Split—Maas Arrested at San Antonio.

Former Belief That Young Woman Was Murdered Is Discredited by Result of Another Autopsy.

Thomasville, Ga., October 15.—(Special.)—It is generally conceded late this afternoon that the coroner's jury, sitting on the case of the death of Miss Dorothy Haug, will bring in a verdict of suicide. This is the result of the autopsy held this afternoon, when a bullet was found in the brain of the young woman. It had been flattened by contact with the skull on the right side, and was lying close to the skin at the back of the head.

The autopsy was held at the suggestion of a detective who was brought to the city by the county authorities for the purpose of studying the mystery which had resulted from her death and the decided expression of opinion by Mr. Mcintosh that the wound could not have been caused by a bullet. He immediately asked an autopsy in order to establish beyond question the cause of the wound. The skull was cut open and at the top of the head, near the right side, the bullet was found.

Wound Very Casual.

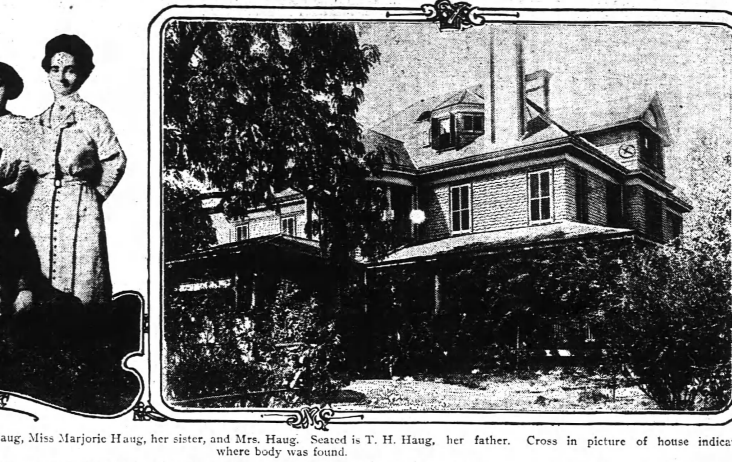

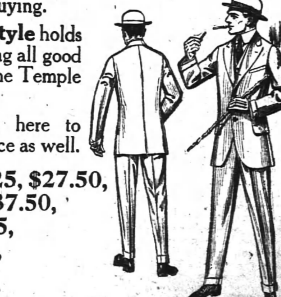
