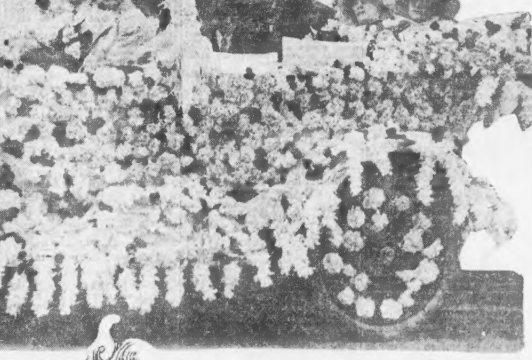

Perry Wins Suit For \$1,599 Against Boston Shoe Firm

Following a five days' trial, most of which was taken up in the reading of correspondence between the plaintiff and defendant, the jury in the suit of George H. Perry vs. the Thomas G. Pratt Company, of Boston, brought in a verdict of \$1,599.40 for Perry late on Tuesday afternoon.

The suit was for a 50 per cent abatement of the net profits of a shoe department in one of the leading Whitehall street stores which was conducted by Perry as manager for the Pratt Company.

Suit was brought in May, 1911, and was argued in the courts most of the following year. It was tried before Judge Ellis in the Superior Court.

9 CITED FOR DEATH TOLL WATERING PRODUCT

One Dairyman Appears in Court and is Fined—Others Forfeited Their Bonds.

With nine cases against milk dealers in the Recorder's Court Tuesday afternoon, W. T. Harwell, city milk inspector, continued to press actively his war against impure and watered milk in Atlanta, and to investigate closely the wares of all suspected dealers.

Nine cases were called, and only one dealer, H. Jones, from the Wallace Mill road—appeared. He was charged with watering his milk. According to the testimony, it was nearly half water. He was fined \$10.75 and given a sharp lecture by the recorder.

Others forfeited bonds.

The other eight dealers forfeited their bonds amounting to \$167.50 in each case. The charge against all was watering of milk.

"I do not want to say all I think about the milk situation in Atlanta," he said, "but I will say one thing—going the limit to improve it."

100 IN LAKE PLAZARD

Restored Communications Bring Fresh Stories of Horrors—Loss to Reach \$5,000,000

CHICAGO, Nov. 11.—Slowly restored communication to-day told of the horror left in the wake of one of the worst storms that have ever visited the Great Lakes region. What the total death toll was between Friday night and yesterday may not be known before several days. The estimate of 100 was generally accepted. Twenty-eight bodies have been washed ashore in different parts of the lake region. Property loss was estimated at nearly \$5,000,000.

Six men met death when lightning No. 82 was wrecked fifteen miles below Buffalo, and the wreckage of the ship was tossed up on the shore.

Twenty-six men and two women were taken off the wrecked steamer Wednesday after they had spent two days on the helpless boat off Fair Rock, expecting to die during the night. They were rescued by the Canadian coast guard.

The vessel was capsized, crew of 40 drowned.

TRIPROVEN, Ont., Nov. 11.—The 12th anniversary of the sinking of the Titanic that lashed Lake Huron Sunday night. She was capsized and all her crew of nearly 60 men perished. The bodies of almost a dozen of the Regina's crew have been washed ashore here. The boat was not floating today, but could not be identified until the bodies washed ashore here gave the clue.

The crew evidently took to the small boats when it seemed their vessel was about to founder, for with the bodies washed ashore here to-day was a life boat, bearing the name "Regina." By the boat were two bodies, the men evidently had been thrown outboard. All the bodies and the boat were found within a radius of five miles along the shore.

150 Killed and 8,000 Made Homeless by Earthquake in Peru

Special Cable to The Atlanta Georgian, LISIA, Nov. 12.—More than 8,000 persons are homeless and at least 150 are dead as the result of an earthquake that occurred last Friday in Abasco, Province.

Beilis Acquitted

Russia as the Part of Great Coward Lacking the Courage to Commit Official Murder

Lacking courage to MURDER directly and officially ONE Jew, Russia conspires to cause the murder of thousands in an infamous, cowardly, judicial decision.

Beilis, the unfortunate Jew selected as a scapegoat by the Czar's Government, goes free.

At least, the protest of civilized humanity has succeeded in accomplishing that the poor, friendless, defenseless, Jewish workman should be executed under the charge of the most heinous and revolting blood guilt.

And he would have been convicted and officially murdered without doubt had not civilization in better lands cried against the outrage and awakened in official Russia the one thing that Russia fears—THE CONTEMPT OF CIVILIZATION.

Beilis is acquitted and freed, and for that all good men and women will be severely thankful.

His judicial murder would have been a horrible outrage, not only a crime against him as an individual, but a crime against his race and his religion.

For the Russian idea was to murder him and with him murder the good name of all the Jews, and to increase with official endorsement of a vile slander the bitter hatred and cruel persecution already existing.

But the intended official crime was stopped by public protest. Russian brutality that has committed so many murders, fomented so many pogroms, lacked the courage to proceed before the eyes of the world with the official killing of ONE individual Jew.

Beilis escapes from the paw of Russia, and that brutal beast, in this case at least, retires growling and baffled.

Unfortunately however, the Government that did not dare to murder officially the individual Jew Beilis has done as much as it could and as much as it dared to murder the reputation of Jews throughout the empire, and to increase the hatred in which the Jews are held by the ignorant, drunken Russians and to add fuel to the flame of persecution and outrage.

The verdict which declares Beilis innocent—because Russia did not dare to execute him—declares also that the murder of which he was accused was a "ritual murder"—that is to say, the Russian Government in this infamous decision seeks to put upon the Jews and their religion all responsibility for the murder charged against Beilis.

The statement is officially made by the court which did not dare to murder the accused individual, that the Jewish religion was responsible for the murder of Yushinsky, that the blood had been spilled to use in their religious ceremonies.

The world knows how infamously false this accusation is. Seven centuries ago Pope Innocent IV denounced the infamously false and over the vile accusation brought to excuse the torture and robbery of the Jews has been disproved.

It is to be hoped, and we may believe that the civilized world has heard of the last infamous charge of this kind in a court of law.

Russia in the face of civilization has not dared to murder the innocent Jew accused of a crime that he has never committed. And if Russia has not dared this time, she will not dare in the future, we may believe.

Unhappily, in Russia, at least, many Jews must suffer because of this infamous Beilis case.

The Russian Black Hundred, the official haters and persecutors of the Jews, have been cheated of their individual victim. They are not to have the satisfaction of murdering Beilis.

But the ignorant peasants will be told that the crime was committed by Jews unknown, and many will suffer.

However, the plans of the Russian Government have been thwarted. The desperate effort to convict Beilis, backed by perjury, conspiracy and cunning, has failed. Every man who has helped to protect that far-off, feeble, defenseless workman Beilis from the bloody creatures thirsting for his blood must feel deeply grateful for the privilege of having said a word in defense of human decency.

The American Israelites in its issue of October 30 says the foremost among those who unsparringly denounced the Czar and his advisers and Russian officialdom for seeking to stigmatize their Jewish subjects as guilty of ritual murder, have been the various Hearst papers in New York, Boston, Chicago, San Francisco and elsewhere. They have not hesitated to speak out plainly and forcibly, and if what the various editors have been saying has no effect in Russia—as it probably will not—still they will have served a purpose, by calling the attention of a large number of reading and thinking people to the brutal wrong which is being done at Kiel. William Randolph Hearst is entitled to the gratitude of all right thinking men.

This expression of thanks is appreciated, but it should be extended to many newspapers, to many organizations and to many individuals. For the protest against the proposed treaty is being world-wide, and it must surely have been heard had not the Hearst newspapers early in the day and with such energy as they possessed taken up the crusade.

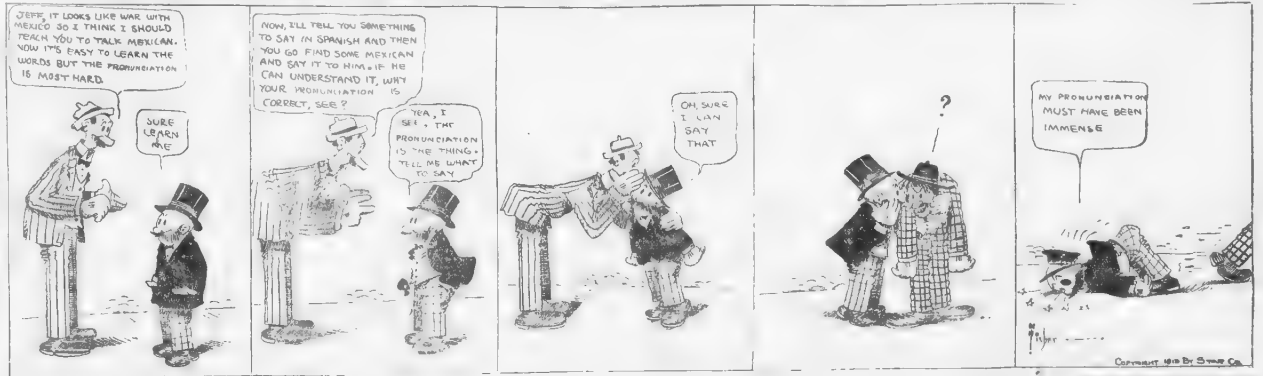

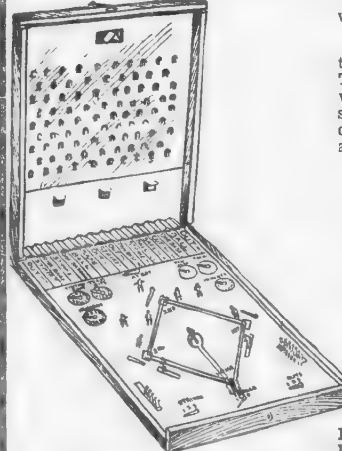

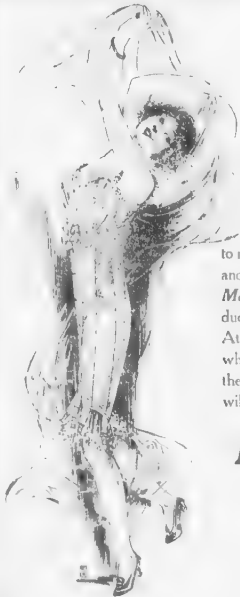
