DOUGS SLEEPING WOMAN; FIRES HOME

2 FAMILIES ARE NEAR DEATH IN FLAMES

Victim of Chloroform Loses Her Diamonds and Purse--Valuable Gowns Are Burned.

Setting fire to an apartment house to conceal a robbery, or to cover his retreat, a daring burglar imperiled the lives of two families early Thursday morning at Nos. 7 and 8 Mills street.

The two-story apartment was discovered in flames at 3:10 o'clock, and the family of Mr. Caroline Duncan, on the lower floor, and that of Carl Witt, on the upper floor, were aroused just in time to save them.

Mrs. Duncan, in particular, was left in a swoon, and had almost to be carried from the building, even after realizing her peril.

Coins and Money Deft. "Oh, I took so drowsy--I can't get my eyes open," she complained later, all said she must have been drugged, for the odor of chloroform still was in her nostrils.

When she discovered that her diamonds and jewelry were missing, and a search in a bureau drawer, reached from the fire, showed that it had been ransacked and her purse, containing \$5, taken.

Police Captain Pugh visited the scene of the fire, which partly destroyed the building.

The blaze appears to have started in the rear of the basement," he said. He detailed two detectives to the case.

Fire Gowns Burned. If Witt is a retired restaurant proprietor, Mrs. Duncan is a fashionable dressmaker, and a large part of her loss in the fire was in the form of handsome gowns, either damaged or destroyed.

"I have lost not less than \$500 worth of gowns outright," she said, "and at least \$1,000 of partly made gowns and material were damaged."

"This case on the surface looks like a thoroughly planned crime," Captain Pugh said. "Of course, the fire may have been accidental, but occurring just on the basis of the drug store robbery, it looks like a ruse to divert attention and to cover a lesser crime."

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Wilson's Program Reported in London

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WILSON QUITS CAPITAL; BREAK BEAR

Wilson's Special Envoy Goes Back to Vera Cruz and Has Effects Removed to Consulate.

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VERA CRUZ, Nov. 12.—John Lind, personal representative of President Wilson to Mexico, arrived here from Mexico City shortly after 8 o'clock this morning. He went directly to the United States Consulate within all his goods were removed last night from the Terminal Hotel by order of Consul Canida.

No agreement was signed here by the arrival of Mr. Lind, though there has been a feeling for more than 24 hours that relations between the United States and Mexico were at the breaking point.

Wilson's Special Envoy Goes Back to Vera Cruz and Has Effects Removed to Consulate.

MEXICO CITY, Nov. 12.—The return of John Lind, special diplomatic representative of President Wilson to Vera Cruz, is looked upon here today as one of the final steps which will lead to an open break between the United States Government and the Huerta regime. His departure within 24 hours.

There appeared to be ground for the belief that President Wilson desired to have Mr. Lind out of this when he makes public in the world the new policy of the United States in the Mexican situation.

Nelson O'Shaughnessy, the United States Charge d'Affaires, spent the entire night in his office at the embassy, sending dispatches to Washington and arranging important state papers. His work was frequently interrupted by calls from American residents of the capital who insisted Mr. O'Shaughnessy's opinion as to whether it would be safe to remain in the capital long.

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The movements of the United States warships in Mexican waters indicated that if intervention in federal matters will be needed immediately at Vera Cruz and Tampico. The Mexico City office of the War Department, however, received word from their branch office at Vera Cruz saying that United States warships probably would be landed within 24 hours.

WILSON TO ANNOUNCE STAND TO-DAY

WASHINGTON, Nov. 13.—Diplomatic relations between the United States and Mexico will be severed within 48 hours unless President Huerta agrees to the more pressing points of the American demands.

This was learned at the State Department to-day. It was supplemented by the additional information that the severance of diplomatic relations will not necessarily mean war unless Huerta takes the initiative against the United States.

President Wilson to-day completed his statement relating to Mexican affairs and announcement was made that it would be made public this afternoon. The statement reviews the negotiations of the past few weeks and defines the policy of the United States. It is understood that dispatches from William Bayard Hale, who conferred yesterday with General Carranza, had a marked influence on the statement.

Secretary of State Bryan to-day received advice from Charge O'Shaughnessy, John Lind and Mr. Hale, which indicates that the Mexican situation has once more reached a climax.

Lind reported that he has left Mexico City for Vera Cruz, where he will remain until recalled by the President. His mission to Mexico City is admittedly a failure. He probably will leave Vera Cruz for the United States within a few days.

Word reached the department that Mr. Lind had gone to the United States Embassy instead of the hotel in Vera Cruz, the police having learned of a plan to assassinate him.

Charge O'Shaughnessy informed the State Department to-day that President Huerta shows no intention of acceding to the demands of the United States. O'Shaughnessy recommends that this Government withdraw all its diplomatic agents and leave Huerta to shift for himself.

The American Charge takes the second time President Huerta has shown himself unalterably opposed to the United States, and that this Government should have nothing further to do with him. In the event of the withdrawal of the American diplomats, the official business of this Government will be placed in the hands of one of the European diplomats in Mexico City.

Nos. 7 and 9 Mills street, after it had been robbed, the boy and his mother, Reynolds, who is 2 years old, were asleep in a room adjoining that of their mother when the blaze was discovered. It is supposed to have started in the rear of the two-story building by Mrs. Duncan in an effort to cover up his tracks.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 13.—President Wilson today let it be known that a favorable development had taken place in the Mexican situation and that the tension of the past 24 hours had been relieved. He told visitors that the prospects of ousting Huerta had improved, but he did not disclose the nature of the information which led him to make this assertion. It is now possible that he will make no announcement whatsoever.

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Train Running Fast

It is said by some of the hysterical survivors that hardly a family living in the lower part of Barbour County escaped without some member of it being killed or injured.

Two hundred and twenty-five tickets had been sold on the train and there were at least that many persons in the wooden coaches. Two coaches were left standing on the rails.

Among the more seriously injured is Jeff Clayton, millionaire brother of Congressman Henry D. Clayton, of Alabama.

Others among the injured are Sheriff R. Teal, of Barbour County, knocked unconscious from a blow caused by falling coaches; Mrs. George Williams, J. H. Wilson, Frank Hayes, John Thacker and Verda Brock, of Louisville, and J. B. Wilkinson, Chas. Veck and Troy Bell, Jr., of Clayton.

The excursion train was running from Ozark to Eufaula, carrying a great crowd to the fair. It was a typical holiday train, gay with new gowns among the women, and recounting with the shrill laughter of the children, and the chattering of the chaff and chatter of a countryside at play was to be heard along the crowded train as it pulled slowly out from Ozark.

Train Running Fast
The train was running rapidly when the accident occurred. Apparently it had picked up the weight of the passengers, and then "sprung" or jumped upward as the train passed through the front track of the station. The coaches were hurled from the end, and in one instant instead of yielding men and women were hurled down the side of the embankment. The train was running at a high rate of speed, and it is believed that it was not until it had passed the broken rail that the cars began to tip. The cars were hurled down the embankment, and the passengers were hurled about as if they were shot from a gun. Many of the injured were women and children, and many of them were killed.

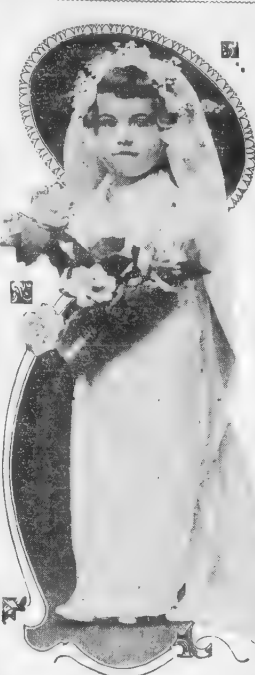

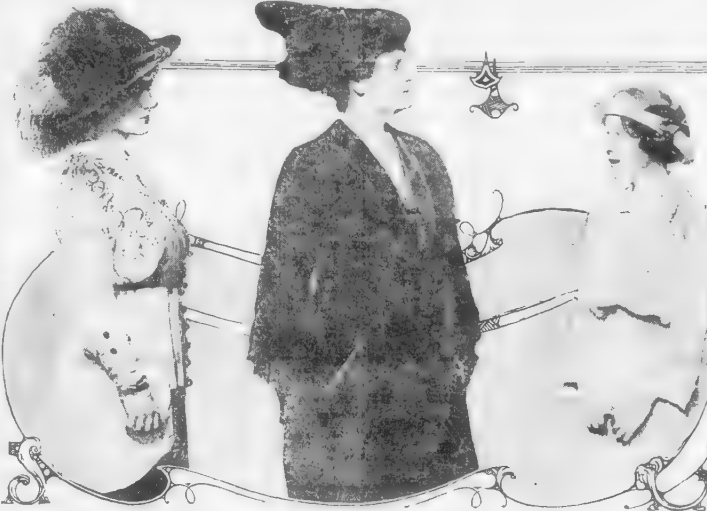

ALARMS NOT AT POINTS AGREED, SAYS MAYOR

New \$100,000 Fire System Omits Recently Amended System, Woodward's Criticism.

Supporters of Mayor Woodward in his criticism of the new \$100,000 fire alarm system found an added argument Wednesday in the fact that it covers only the territory of the old system. The contract has been completed, but there are no boxes in Ashley Park, David Hill, East Atlanta, Oakland City or in any territory recently annexed.

It is just another evidence of the bad management in awarding that contract," said Mayor Woodward. "It is a moral obligation contract and therefore illegal, but if it were a legitimate contract, the total cost of \$100,000 to entirely too high."

"No more has been made to get

any pay on the contract, and I have not had occasion to make a thorough investigation of the matter.

To Make Through Probe.
"I will look closely into this affair to provide alarm boxes in Ashley Park and the new sections. The only reason for building a new system, as I understand it, was to give priority to these sections as soon as the citizens of these sections are preparing to make vigorous protests through their Councilmen.

The Chief Cummings explained the situation as follows:
"The contract adopted by the Board of Firemen and the Council, whether it be legal or illegal, did not provide for any more than has been done. We have fifty new boxes to be put up in these sections as soon as there is some agreement on the contract."

"We can make these alterations and give these people fire protection at a very little cost. Until then they will have to use the telephone."

New Stations Wanted.
An urgent matter to come before the Finance Committee in January will be the need of a fire engine house in Ashley Park.

The nearest station is on North Avenue, and the residents complain that every time there is a fire there the house is down before the fire engine arrives.

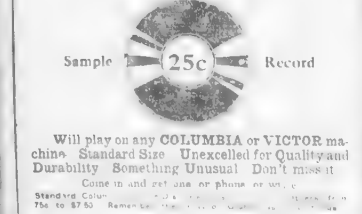

To Build a Model City.

That is the Idea Now Agitating Governments. By the Time It is Realized the City May Be Out of Date.

The American sculptor, Christian Andersen, has interested various governments, including our own and that of the Kaiser and the King of England, in a plan to build a modern international city to cost a hundred million dollars.

The matter is really seriously discussed and sites have been suggested on the New Jersey coast, the coast of Holland near The Hague, on the Mediterranean between Cannes and Monte Carlo, on the shore of Lake Neuchatel, in Switzerland; at St. Germain, just outside of Paris; in the Sea of Marmora, near Constantinople and other places.

Discuss with your family what YOU would call a model city and how you would build it, if you had a hundred millions to spend.

We are inclined to think that it would be impossible to construct a pleasing city even with unlimited money, just as it is impossible to construct a new pleasing language.

A language or a city is a GROWTH OR AN EVOLUTION LIKE AN INDIVIDUAL.

The best that humanity can do is to improve the individuals and the cities that exist.

Atlanta has accomplished wonders in the way of building, rising, as it were, upon the very ashes of war into a great metropolis of promise.

Berlin has done more, perhaps, than any other city in existence in the way of general improvement.

San Francisco is a marvel of the world in her sudden uprising from the fire, but it is not a new city, for the City IS THE SPIRIT OF THE CITIZENS, and that spirit was there. Fire could not destroy it.

Alexander the Great planned a really remarkable combination of a model city and a piece of gigantic self glorification.

His modest scheme was to cut a statue of himself out of solid mountain of rock, a statue so vast that the outstretched arm would support wide boulevards and aqueducts AND THE CITY BE BUILT IN THE PALM OF THE STATUE'S HAND.

That notion of building a city and having the city in the palm of your own hand was worthy of Alexander. He might have carried out the plan if he had combined with the power to rule others THE POWER TO RULE HIMSELF - that is to say, in plain language, if he could have kept from getting drunk. The getting drunk exposed him to disease and disease killed him, and the statue holding a city in its hand was not completed.

If the nations should combine to build a model city it would be very interesting, very pretty.

But one single villa perched high on stone walls above a deep cut street in a corner of Rome would supply more food to the human imagination than the entire model city.

And one queer little village like La Tourbie, perched on a rock and overlooking the Mediterranean, would be more interesting than forty model cities.

As a matter of fact, the model city or otherwise, as we now know it, will, in our humble opinion, before long, be only a memory like the nest of the rook that used to lay eggs as big as your market basket, or the colonies of beavers.

The flying machine will mean the end of the city for dwelling purposes.

The day is not far distant when what we now call the city will be a great office building with a gigantic factory to which the workers will fly in the morning from their separate homes on the hills and the plains far distant, and from which they will fly at night—like sea gulls flying to and from their work.

Men have gathered in cities because walking is painful and travel is slow. Human beings now living will see the workers of the humble kind travel a hundred miles in twenty-five minutes or less, from their little houses and their little patch of ground, to the big industrial beehive or city in which their work will be done.

The city will be a building perhaps a mile or more high, with landings at various altitudes.

The late Paul Morton, president of the Equitable Life Assurance Society, used to talk about tearing down the old building which has since burned down, and building another building. He said that if he was not afraid of being laughed at he would certainly plan a tower for a landing place for flying machines.

Those living will see such towers and many of them.

They will see the day when all men and women will go to their work THROUGH THE ROOF INSTEAD OF FROM THE GROUND FLOOR.

The high hills now abandoned will be covered then with individual palaces and model apartment houses.

The city with its dirty, dusty, filthy, crowded streets will vanish and in its material way civilization will begin.

If you want to make money for your great-grandchildren buy hill tops cheap. They will be choice real estate before very long.

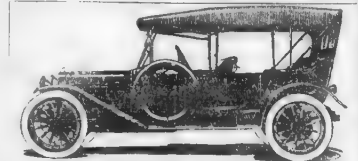
