The excursion train was running from Ozark to Eufaula, carrying a great crowd to the Barbour County Fair at that place. It was a typical holiday train, gay with new gowns among the women, and reounding with the shrill laughter and shouts of the children.

And there the rest of the county was turned suddenly into a town of mourning and sorrowful activity, as homes were opened to receive and care for the injured men, women and children. There was no hospital in the town, and all the available physicians, with those brought hastily from neighboring towns, could not attend to the wounded without delay.

### Huerta Ready to Resign

### FINAL ORDER TO DICTATOR TO GET OUT

### U. S. Prepares to Blockade Mexican Ports if He Does Not Vacate by Saturday.

Special Cable to The Atlanta Georgian. MEXICO CITY, Nov. 14 (reop). General Huerta is expected to resign within 24 hours. The important messages are now going on at the National Palace. Charles of Affairs O'Shaughnessy believes that an important announcement is to be made by the president in a few hours. An important dispatch was sent to the American State Department shortly before noon. This gave a summary of developments of the last 12 hours. It is believed that Huerta will announce his resignation to Congress to-morrow and request the selection of another President ad interim. Full compliance with the United States demand means that the resignation will be accepted and Congress will then order another election.

NOGALES, ARIZ., Nov. 14.—The city of Nogales, capital of Sonora, was captured to-day by Mexican rebels after a desperate battle lasting three days.

### Blockade to Back Up Final Ultimatum.

Special Cable to The Atlanta Georgian. VERA CRUZ, Nov. 14.—Special survey John Lind has sent an ultimatum to the Mexican Government. This was revealed here to-day by a man of general Huerta. The ultimatum insists that Huerta yield to all demands of the United States by Sunday. The alternative is an immediate blockade of all Mexican ports by American ships. Lind's demand was transmitted to Huerta in a code dispatch sent shortly after midnight. It was telegraphed to an official of the Mexican Government who was sent here from Mexico City. He conferred secretly with Lind and was informed that the only basis on which diplomatic negotiations could continue. This official is an intimate friend of the Mexican dictator and is acting as a personal envoy of Huerta.

### Huerta Reappears After Visit to Wine Cellar.

Special Cable to The Atlanta Georgian. MEXICO CITY, Nov. 14.—The international situation looks brighter. The significant messages were made to-day by Senator Mobern, Minister of Foreign Affairs, following an all-night conference of Senator Alcala, Minister of Interior; Senator Loomis, Minister of Public Instruction; Senator Noriega, Minister of Communications; and Senator Moreno. General Huerta was reported to have conferred in a dining room of the new Congress which is scheduled to convene to-morrow afternoon. Several other persons are said to have been present. It was explained that the dictator abandoned his policy of deserting the United States. ### HOWARD TO FORCE QUIET BY HOUSE

### Fights Moyer Whittaking—Declares He Has Facts Making Inquiry Imperative.

Warden Moyer's administration of affairs at the Atlanta Federal Prison and the disgraceful conditions alleged to exist there will receive a searching investigation regardless of the action of Attorney General McReynolds. This was the declaration made Friday by Congressman William S. Boyer Howard of Atlanta, who has been insistent in his demands for a probe of the charges of incompetency and general unfitness against the warden. "I don't know that the Attorney General was quoted correctly in the recent interviews," said Congressman Howard, "but if he was, am I certain that his remarks were to be construed as meaning that he was going to drop the Atlanta controversy altogether without any show of an investigation."

Howard Determined. "However, his intentions are really a matter of indifference to me. For there is going to be an investigation of the prison and the conditions there and it's going to be a thorough one if my efforts count for anything. "I shall introduce a resolution when I return to Washington calling for a Congressional investigation of every detail of the prison administration here in Atlanta. If the resolution is adopted there will be three Democratic members and two Republican. "The Department of Justice is only a creature of Congress at its best. I am not deeply concerned about its attitude in the matter, although I had been given to understand that an impartial investigation would be made by persons wholly independent of any bias or feeling for or against Warden Moyer and his subordinates. "Has Important Facts. "If the probe is abandoned, I shall be surprised, for it will not interfere in the least with my plans for an investigation. I shall return to Washington within a few days and lay before Congress my reasons for an investigation. "I do not wish to appear in the role of a judge before any formal investigation is made, but I am in possession of facts that make it imperative for me to seek to have the light of publicity thrown on affairs out there. "From personal observation, I am convinced that the prisoners have been underfed. I know that there is a 'dungeon' there in which prisoners may be handcuffed to the bars in suits of all details. There are a lot of other conditions that will come to light when the investigation is started. Not all of them will have to do directly with the treatment of the prisoners. Considerable time will be spent in looking into the way the government's money has been expended in construction work."

### Food Better Since Mutiny, Says Freed Man

The quality of the food served in the Federal Prison has materially improved since the mutiny of several weeks ago, according to J. E. Lewis, who was released Thursday after spending a year and a day in the penitentiary. Lewis said the Department of Justice has been conducting an investigation into the affairs of the prison for the last two weeks, but that the manner in which it is being held makes it plain that it is to be a whitewash. Lewis, who says he was formerly a mutineer, estimates the prison officials.

### Gates Estate Goes To Mother and Widow

NEW YORK, Nov. 14.—Charles G. Gates, who died two weeks ago, divided his fortune equally between his mother, Mrs. John W. Gates and his widow, Mrs. Florence Hopwood Gates. The mother is executrix. The estate is estimated at \$2,000,000 to \$3,000,000.

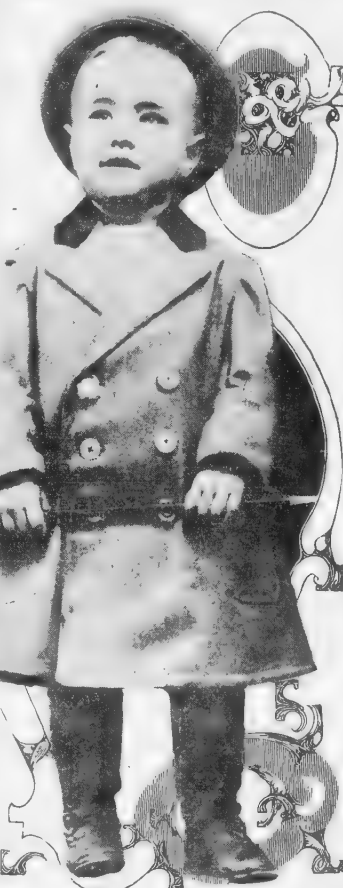

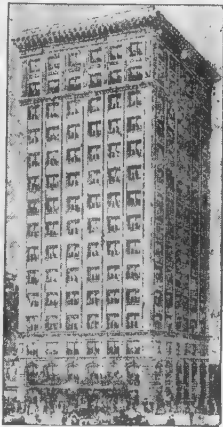

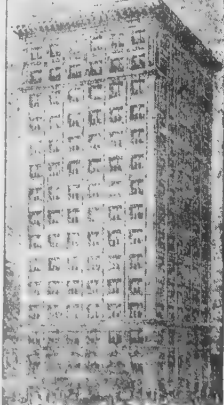

"One dollar in—two dollars out.

"For every dollar that the State received in 1912 from liquor licenses, it paid out over two dollars in caring for the criminals, paupers and insane brought to our institutions through drink."

This is the evidence of Massachusetts.

A. D. Cutler was Police Commissioner in San Francisco.

He writes: "I notice a paragraph saying that:

**"DIRECTLY, INDIRECTLY ONE-HALF OF OUR CRIMES ARE DUE TO DRINK.**

"While Police Commissioner in San Francisco, it was my custom to examine the records of the City Prison frequently, showing all the crimes and other particulars attending arrests that numbered about 200 daily, and my conclusion was that FULLY 90 PER CENT WERE DUE DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY TO THE USE OF LIQUOR.

"Again, all saloons in San Francisco were closed for thirty days following the great fire in April 1906, the result being that there was so little police duty necessary in spite of the great confusion growing out of the fire that one-half of the police force were given vacations for periods of from ten to thirty days.

"When the saloons were again opened the officers on vacations were recalled, as it was deemed necessary to place the entire force on duty because of the increased crime and disorder."

**"NINETY-FIVE PER CENT OF THOSE WHO WENT TO PRISON IN 1911 HAD INTEMPERATE HABITS."**

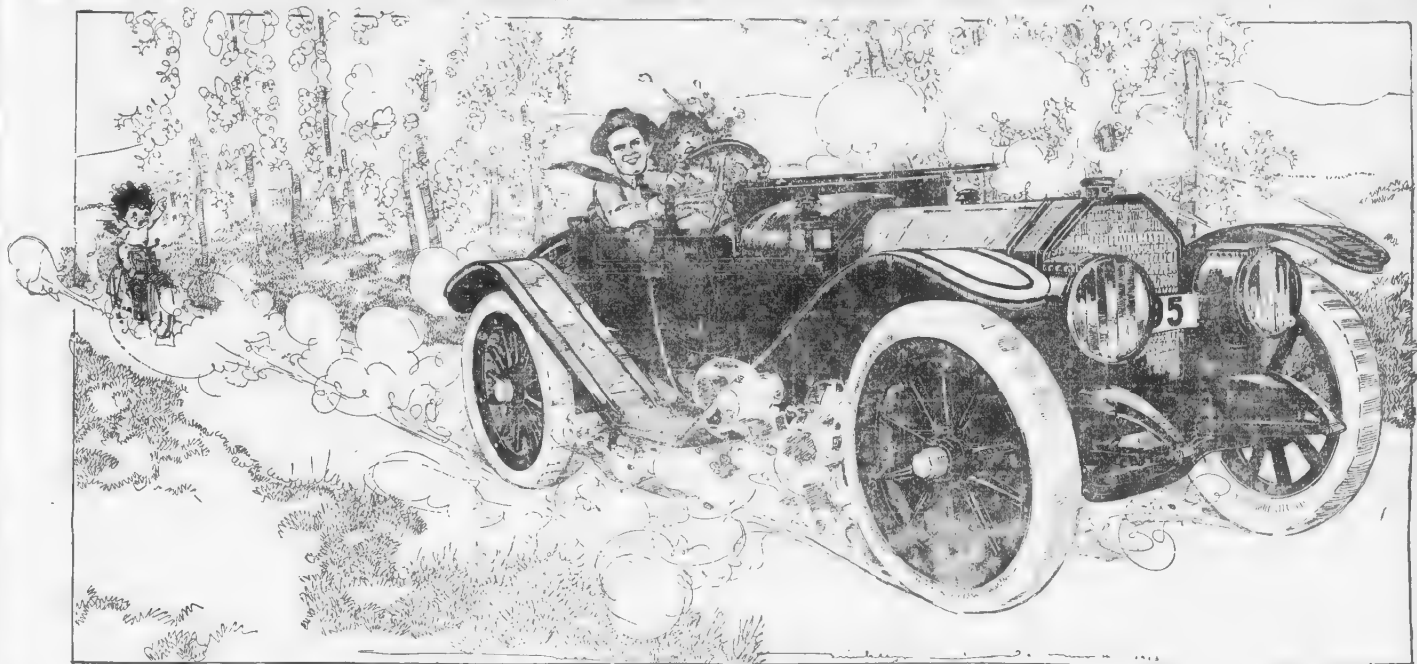

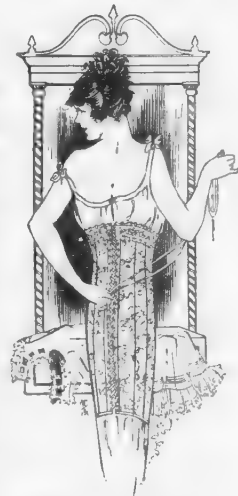

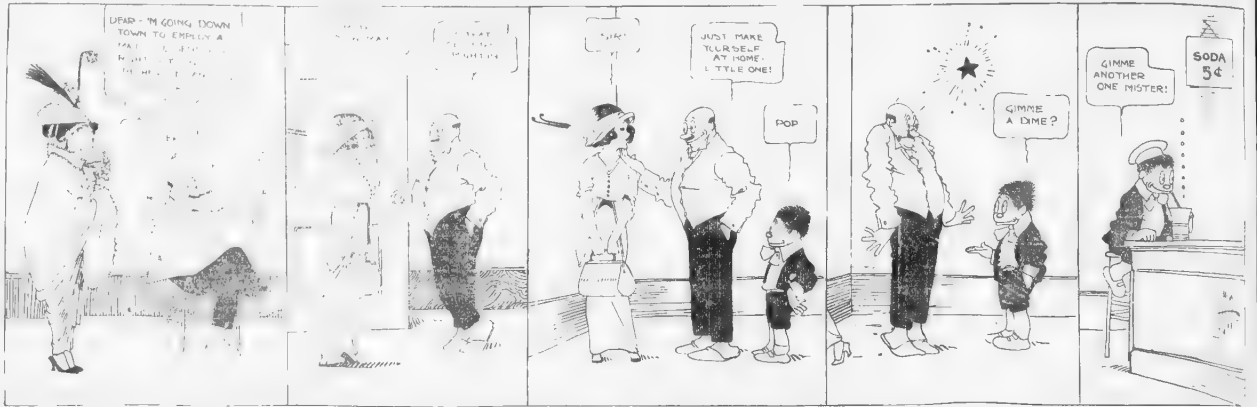
