CRACKSMEN FAIL TO GET \$8,000

High's Strong Box Holds Against Nitroglycerin, Saving \$6,000 Cash and Valuables.

When Miss Dora Gibbs, cashier for the J. M. High Company, went to the safe in the office on the second floor Tuesday morning, she was started to see a great pile of bedding on the floor in front of the tall steel box. Then she noticed that the combination had been torn off, and a closer inspection showed the door to have been drilled and otherwise damaged. The safe had been "blown" nearly, but inside it, protected by a special lock, was \$8,000 in money and \$3,000 worth of jewelry and other valuables. The money and the valuables were safe—so safe that the company itself couldn't open the door. The special burglar-proof lock, a patented device, is made to spring as soon as any violent attempt is made on the door, shooting great bolts across the inside and holding the doors in place against attacks by dynamite or even nitroglycerine. It was nitroglycerine, or "moon," as the safecracker call it, that was used on the strong box. A hole had been drilled along side the combination and a full charge exploded under the muffling covers and blankets. The combination was torn off, but the great bolts had held the door in place and the safecrackers had departed, leaving behind them only a hair-burned cinder on the top of the safe. W. K. Mower, agent in Atlanta for the Anshutz Burglar Proof Lock, sees a man to the store to work on the safe device, which was holding out sturdily and impartially and guarding the contents of the safe even against its rightful owners.

PROSPERITY PROVED BY REVENUE

Municipal Treasury Will Have \$25,000 Unappropriated Surplus at End of the Year.

Impressive evidence of Atlanta's prosperity is shown by the record increase of more than \$185,000 in tax returns for 1913 over 1912. It not only is a greater amount than any former year's increase, but is approximately \$2,000,000 the increase anticipated in the final revision of the city budget. With city officials winding up the business of the year the figures show an unappropriated surplus of about \$25,000 in Atlanta's income.

A compilation of the figures was completed Tuesday by City Tax Receiver George Beauchamp. The total assessments aggregate \$112,327,477, against \$114,517,487 in 1912. Of this amount approximately \$10,000,000 is made up of real and personal assessments of private citizens and corporations, and \$10,000,000 in real and personal assessments of public utility corporations.

The increase in assessments on private property is \$16,514,872; \$155,000 for 1913, and \$142,865,325 for 1912. Public Utilities' increase. The increase on public utilities, assessments on which are made by State Comptroller Wright, is approximately \$2,000,000. The assessments on the utilities for 1913 were \$12,022,159. He has not made a final addition to the assessments for this year, but a conservative estimate is that they will exceed \$14,000,000.

Mayor Woodward and the Council anticipated a substantial increase, but the figures have gone beyond their expectations. When the January budget was made up, Mayor Woodward presented the committee from following the old custom of appropriating a conservative estimate of the increase. No increased revenue was added to the budget until it was revised in 1913, and only the amount that came in sight. When in October it came time to revise the budget again, the Finance Committee attempted to include the total of the increase in revenue. The figure to 1912, showed that they fell by about \$2,000,000, although there were demands far in excess of the amount made available for expenditure.

The city treasury, therefore, is found in a condition never known before. Since the year is so near a close, it is likely the money will be carried over to the new Council to spend.

In fact Tax Receiver George Beauchamp is making every effort to keep the figures secret. He has shown them to Mayor Woodward and a few friends, but only a few of the Council members know of the situation. Try to Keep Figures Secret. Receiver Beauchamp Tuesday refused to give out the official figures. When he completed them Tuesday he locked them in his desk and left the City Hall. He said that Mayor Woodward had advised him to keep them secret for fear members of Council might attempt to appropriate the money for needed improvements.

Mr. Beauchamp, however, is making his last show of authority, measure passed by the last General Assembly, to make his office a separate department and make of it a clerkship under the Tax Receiver, J. L. Harrison, C. D. Medford and J. N. Hill.

J., awaited the arrival of the bride party.

In almost the very spot where took place the wedding of Miss Nellie Alice Roosevelt and Representative Nicholas Longworth, Miss Wilson became the thirteenth White House bride.

Velvet and plush corsets popped off the room into sections and formed an aisle along which the bride every proceeded to the altar. The Marine Band played the wedding march. None of the guests were seated.

Invitations were handled in a way typical of President Wilson, Washington residential society, which received great recognition at the hands of Colonel Roosevelt, was almost totally ignored. The reason given for this was the fact that Miss Wilson and the members of her family have been in Washington long enough to become extensively acquainted.

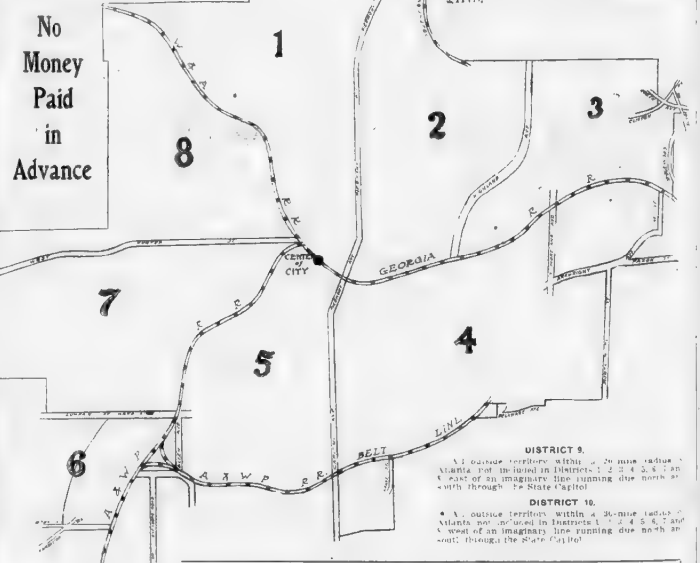
