## U. S. Troops Are Rushed to City Federal Convicts Beaten, He Charges

### RAPS MOYER ON LEAVING PRISON

Released Man Upholds Hawthorne's Charges—Says Clubbing Crazy One Prisoner.

"I haven't any personal grudge to satisfy. I haven't even any complaint to make of the manner in which I was treated, but I am talking for those men back there who are being made to suffer the torments of hell!" Harry O'Brien, just released from the Atlanta Federal Prison after serving nineteen months and six days of a two-year sentence, uttered this explanation at the conclusion of his interview with The Georgian, in which he earnestly pictured conditions at the penitentiary as brutal and revolting and the administration as utterly inefficient.

One convict, who having made from the treatment he had received at the house of a guard, and others had been cruelly beaten, O'Brien said his tale finished. O'Brien boarded a train for New York, from where he will go to Auburn, Maine, his old home, where he will resume his former vocation as an evangelist.

Although O'Brien's offense was in the nature of a technical violation of the law, he was free in admitting before starting back home that he had lied.

"I'm going to live in decent, though," he declared grimly. "My wife and I both fought in the war. Both of us were entitled to pensions. I was getting the limit in which I was entitled under the law, but I found the time to get more. I didn't realize the gravity of the offense. As I viewed it, I was not defrauding the government of anything which it should not pay. I can see it differently now."

The convict-angel declared the stories of kindly treatment of the prisoners.

"They're the only ones of all them."

"Men have been clubbed until they could not get up, because they had been given the hardest food that was set before them. With me was even a hole sent that."

"A bigger because he got in a pretty row with another convict, was strangled stiff by a hook from one of the guards. Then he was given fifteen days in the punishment house."

"The convicts at the prison, almost to a man believe that the prisoner known as 'Dumky' did not do the work of a man with which a guard befell him."

Her recipe calls for two quarts of stale bread, crumbed and seasoned with two level teaspoons of salt, a heaping teaspoon of pepper, two teaspoons each of powdered mustard, savory and minced parsley and six powdered sage. Then rub a cupful of butter through the crumb, and fill the cavity of the turkey with this and set it.

Mrs. Clark then rubs salt all over the turkey, puts it in a roasting pan, spreads a tablespoon of butter over the breast and places it in a medium hot oven. The turkey should be baked every ten minutes with its own gravy until done.

## U. S. MEXICANS ADVANCE ON TEXAS CITY

### Hotel Train Brings Over Six Hundred Prisoners Into Juarez and One Thousand Are on Way.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 26.—In response to a request from General Bliss, the Twentieth Infantry, from Fort Douglas, Ariz., today is ordered to El Paso, Texas, to assist in the settlement of affairs along the line at Juarez.

It is reported that bands of Federal troops are marching on Juarez, which is contending to this city, caused alarm among the inhabitants and resulted in the flight of more troops.

General Bliss, in the telegram to Secretary of War Garrison, declared a border patrol of cavalry should be organized as he did not have enough troops there to defend El Paso from the advance of the Mexicans.

General Bliss, in a radio message to the Secretary of War, described the conditions at Juarez and the necessity for a more complete control of the Mexican Frontier.

### Released Man Upholds Hawthorne's Charges—Says Clubbing Crazy One Prisoner.

"I haven't any personal grudge to satisfy. I haven't even any complaint to make of the manner in which I was treated, but it is all talking for those men back there who are being made to suffer the torture of hell!" Harry Orburn, now released from the Atlanta Federal Prison after serving nineteen months and six days of two-year sentence, uttered this warningly inefficient.

His tale finished, Orburn boarded a train for New York. From there he will go to Auburn, Maine, his old home, where he will resume his former vocation as an evangelist. He was sentenced from Portland, Maine, on the charge of making false affidavits to obtain pardon money.

Although Orburn's offense was in the nature of a technical violation of the law, he was free in admitting before starting back home that he had served "time" going to live it down, though, he declared firmly. "My wife and I both fought in the war. Both of us were entitled to pensions. I was getting the limit to which I was entitled under the law, but I used my name to get more. I didn't realize the gravity of the offense. As I viewed it, I was not defrauding the government of anything which it should not pay. I can see it differently now."

The convict-advocate detailed the stories of kindly treatment of the prisoners.

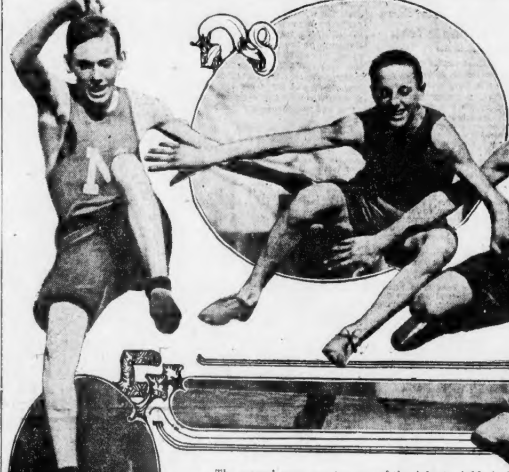
"They're fine," he said, "like all of them."

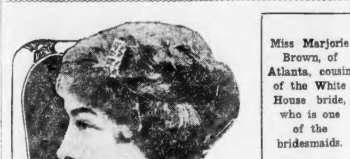
