Max Lillie, a Chicago aviator, is the latest martyr to flight.

Almost ever since the air game has been played in that section of the country Lillie has been flying. At every fair and every other outdoor function where an aeroplane might be an added attraction, there was Lillie flying safely, sanely, steadily. He looped no loops, he dipped no dips, but was a living example of the art of making a dangerous pursuit safe.

As aviator after aviator in the East, in the West, in Europe tumbled from the clouds, the immunity of Max Lillie became more and more widely known.

Lillie himself modestly explained why this was so.

"Flying is my business," he said. "I expect to keep up my business as long as it is profitable. My business is not turning somersaulis or seeing how near I can come to breaking my neck, but it is to exhibit the art of flying.

IT IS AS SAFE AS RUNNING AN AUTOMOBILE AT

'If a man insists on jumping fences in an automobile, or running with one wheel in the ditch, or seeing how sharply he could turn a corner, he would be doing practically what those aviators are doing who are looking for applause because of the thrills they furnish.'

So this man who flew every day and any day, who never went up without thoroughly inspecting his machine, who knew, if anybody knows, the highways of the upper air, has demon-strated that, no matter what the future may have in store, THE FLYING MACHINE IS NOT YET SUITED FOR A POPULAR
