



Another distinct victory for public opinion, comme and the Hearst newspapers is the decision in Washington to acecpt Colonel Goethals' plan for the completion and operate the Panama Canal and the administration of the Canal Zone. The Hearst newspapers find satisfaction in having expressed, at a critical moment, the exasperation of the public when it learned that the great builder of the canal was being harassed by med-dlesome amateurs whose ability to attain great executive achiev-

dissome amateurs whose ability to attain great executive acmev-ment has never been demonstrated.

The recommendation by Governor Metcalfe—Secretary Bryan's editor—that the canal be governed by a three-headed commission has been rejected. There will be one governor both of the canal and the sone with burseau under his authority, proor the canal and the sone with bureaus under his authority, pro-viding, as Colonel Goethals suggested, "s compact organisation able to handle efficiently and economically the entire situation" and "REMOVING THE ZONE FROM ALL POSSIBLE RELA

and "ERMOVIAN AREA OF THE TOP OF THE PROPERTY Moreover, the railroad and the canal will be consolidated, and the superintendent of the railroad will report direct to the Governor. The idea of separating the conal and the railroad was prepoterous, and such a proceeding would have been fraught with the most awkward and senseless consequences, especially in the matters of resulting competition and the equipment of a wast coaling station for he trading facts of the world.

There is no time to be lost. Now that intrigue has been outsided by common sense, it only remains for the President and Congrue to give Colonel Goethals whole-hearted and prompt encouragement and assistance.


