It is reliably, though unofficially, reported at Washington that Democratic leaders in the Senate bave practically agreed to effect a change in that section of the tariff bill which places a tax of fifty cents a bale on contracts for future cotton delivery. Business men everywhère, and particularly in the South, will hope that there may be not merely a change but an outright abolishment of this unjust and dangerous provision. The proposed tax has no rightful place in a tariff measure. It will accomplish no worthy end. But it will imperial a great needl of commercial and agricultural interests. It will injure the farmer and the manufacturer as well as the cotton merchant and will set in motion a train of hardships and losses, the end of which no one can foressee. Rightfunded men all agree that gambling in cotton should be outhwed. But no man who understands the real purpose and use of future contracts afford the merchant his only safeguard against the caseless fluctuations of the cotton market. The merchant may obligate himself today to deliver to a mill a certain number of bales at a fixed price. But unless he has some means of heddings' or protecting himself against; those confinences and offen violent changes, to which cotton more than any other commodity is subject, he may find that he cannot fainful his agreement without ruinous loss. Indeed, it is essential to the very existence of the conton traced that the merchant have some opportunity to protect himself against these functions and that is the opportunity which the some opportunity to protect himself against these fluctuations; and that is the opportunity which the

The effect of this useful system is obviously toward maintaining a fair price for cotton, for the dealer could not afford to offer such a price, if he were compelled to incur all the risks of his business with no safeguard. Clearly, therefore, a large portion of the proposed tax would have to be paid out of the farmer's earnings; and in the final analysis such a tax would prove tremendously harmful to all those important interests which the production, the merchandles and the manufacture of exiton include. Cotton exchanges should be duly regulated but their legitimate uses should not be blindly isnored. However desirable it may be to prohibit wild and unwholesome speculation, Congress should certainly not destroy nor discourage a thoroughly normal and mecsaary process of the country's business life. The attempt to risk the cotton trade of gambling by virtually abolishing, the future outract is as foolish as it would be to use a pair of tongs in trying to get a clinder from a main 4 ye. Hope for Bird Protection.

Everyone interested in the world-wide movement for the protection of valuable birds is pleased to learn of the brightened outlook for helpful legisla-tion of this character at the present session of Congress. The tariff bill, as originally passed by the House, contained a wholesome clause prohibiting the importation of feathers and plumage from cer-tain important species of birds for commercial uses. This provision was inserted in the bill largely at This provision was inserted in the bill largely at the instance of conservationists and leaders of Audu-bon societies who realized the great economic cost as well as the unspeakable crucities that are in-volved in plumage traffic. The House assented to this clause without opposition, and rightly so, for it represented not only a worthy sentiment but also a logical conviction held by thousands of think-ture recent the nation occurs.

But when this particular provision of the tariff measure was taken under consideration by the Senate finance committee, it was so amended as practically to destroy its usefulness. Exceptions were made one after another until the prohibitive clause was stripped of all its original force and the way for destructive commerce in bird life was loft as wide open as ever. On what theory or for what motive this was done, is not altogether clear. When the supporters of the bird protection movement realized what had happened, how-ver, they redoubled their efforts and brought to bear such a pressure of intelligent opining that the Senate has referred the illadvised amendment to the committee for reconsideration; and now there is reason to hope that the amendment will be stricken out. This may be regarded as a minor issue and, as compared with the larger ends of tariff revision, it is. It should not be permitted to encumber or delay the essential purposes of the bill. Nor is there any necessity that it should. The standest protectionist and the standest five trader should be able to agree that it would be a wise and bumane thing for this Government to set the world a good example by prohibiting the importation of plumage which is obtained only through the brutal slaughter of rare and valuable birds.




