(By Associated Press.) CHICAGO, Aug. 29.—Thirty-two persons died in Fourth of July celebrations this year, fewer than in any year since statistics began recording the toll of fireworks. Figures gathered by the Journal of the American Medical association and published today compare this total to that of 466 in 1908, the first year the association counted the victims, and gave rise to the prediction that the "annual orgy of death and destruction soon will cease."

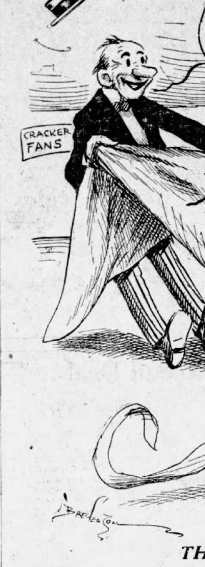

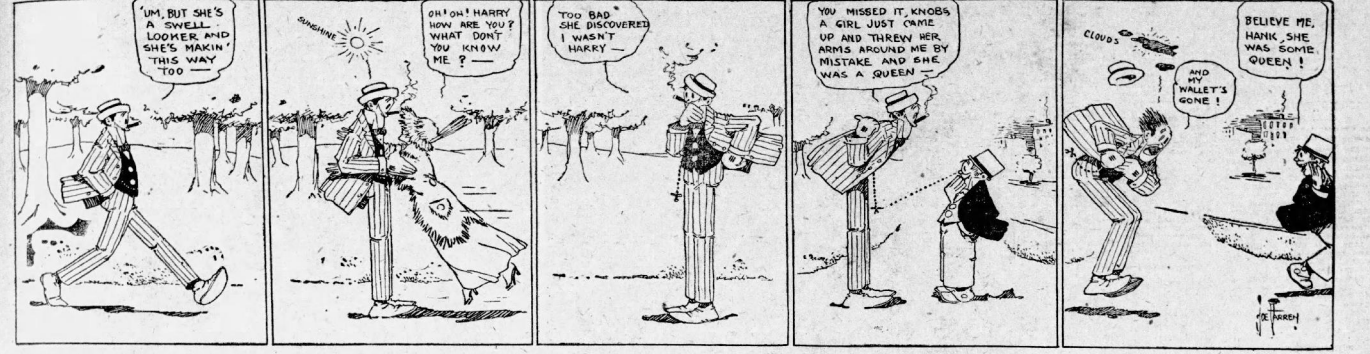
