### England Wants Big Change in Tennis Rules

By Associated Press.

NEW YORK, Dec. 22.—As if to atone for its oversight in permitting the formation of the International Lawn Tennis federation to be undertaken by continental authorities, the English Lawn Tennis association is now coming to the fore with numerous suggestions for changes in the Davis-cup and general tennis playing rules. The English association proposes to submit all the international lawn tennis federation meeting in March a new service regulation which is at wide divergence with the present code.

The radical departure from the existing rules can be perceived when it is understood that if the new regulation is adopted it will be necessary for the server, to replace the foot raised from the ground in service, behind the base line before stepping into the court, instead of swinging into the court with the raised foot once the service is completed, as is permissible under the existing code. This change would have the effect of slowing up a player who followed his service with a ruff to the net and since a large proportion of English players advocate the deep court game it would be less detrimental to the English game than to that of almost any other country where tennis has reached high class status.

A number of changes in the rules governing the Davis cup play also are put forward as desirable, although England lost the international tennis trophy last July when the United States team defeated the cup defenders, three matches out of five. The English association would allow the playing of Davis cup matches on turf- or courts of natural or artificial gritty material which depreciation appears more likely to fit a gravel than a dirt court. Another proposed change would bar a player from competing for any country but the one which he represented in his first Davis cup play.

FEAR ARCTIC EXPLORERS HAVE LOST SHIP IN ICE

Friends of Stefansson say, However, Party Was Prepared to Stand Loss

SATTLE, Wash., Dec. 22.—Notwithstanding the publication of interviews with persons who say they are sure that Vilhjalmur Stefansson's arctic ship Karuk, under command of Captain Robert Bartlett, must be lost, Stefansson's friends on the coast are not alarmed. When the expedition sailed Stefansson hoped the Karuk would not be chattered by the ice until it had attained a considerable distance northeast of Point Barrow. However, he found ice close to the point and entered a lead with the intention of being frozen in. The ship was frozen in and is supposed to be drifting with the ice. The danger always present in a lead is that its sides will close and crush the boat. The Karuk is not built to withstand a squeeze by the ice. However, Stefansson told friends here before leaving that the Karuk's crew and scientists would be safe, even if the ship were crushed, as they were prepared to take to the ice. Stefansson's personal acquaintance with all the Eskimos and the Mackenzie river should arrive at Dawson about January 1, carried by the Canadian mounted police. Bouillon Cubes Nearly All Salt and of Little Food Value, Experts Say

Analyses of Department of Agriculture Disclose Important Ingredient, Meat Extract, Is Sadly Lacking

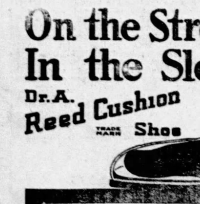
(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) WASHINGTON, D. C., Dec. 22.—A popular fallacy concerning the nutritive value of bouillon cubes, such as are used in the sick room and dispensed at soda fountains, has been shattered by experts of the federal department of agriculture. Investigations and analyses by the department has disclosed that most of the commercial bouillon cubes contain from 50 to 75 per cent table salt. As they range in price from 10 to 20 cents an ounce, purchasers of these cubes pay an exceedingly high price for salt when they buy the cubes. The analyses show that the cubes contain a small amount of protein (muscle-bone material) and have some stimulating properties, but that they are sadly lacking in concentrated sources of meat, both as a source of food and as a source of vitamins. Besides the common salt which constitutes from 40 to 75 per cent of the total weight, the amount of meat extract ranges from 8 per cent in the poorest brands to but 24 per cent in the very best. The third important ingredient is plant or vegetable extract which constitutes from 2 to 20 per cent. This plant extract is useful because of its flavoring properties but has slight if any nutritive value. The department's meat chemist has carefully analyzed semi-solid meat extracts, and most extracts, and commercial meat juices, which are offered to the market to the American public in addition to the bouillon cubes. He has also conducted experiments in making home-made beef broth and meat and vegetable soups. A comparison of the relative costs of commercial and home-made meat preparations has resulted in the following table:

Both the bouillon cubes and the meat soups are stimulating and flavoring agents, but have only a slight food value and are more expensive than home-made soups. Two Big Engines Dashed From Trestle to River

AUGUSTA, Ga., Dec. 22.—Two Southern railway passenger engines and four freight cars are in the middle of the Savannah river, due to the two engines, which were being towed over from the Hamburg yards, running into about twenty freight cars which were standing on the trestle as 4:30 this morning. An entire span fell and the engines, freight cars and a portion of the trestle are in one twisted and unrecognizable mass of wreckage in the water. One engine was not completely submerged, due to falling on a jetty. Hoester, C. C. Forber, who was on engine 1193, and was pulling engine 265, was badly bruised as was Jimmie Bryant, call boy. Bert Corbett, a negro helper on 265, was also bruised. According to Forber, there were no lights on the cars which had been left on the trestle and the night was dark. Forber and Bryant, by presence of mind in holding their breath under the water, climbed out on to some wreckage and called for assistance. Corbett did not get into the water. All three men were rescued by a boat. No official statement has been made by the Southern officials as yet.
