CONLEY'S EVIDENCE PREJUDICIAL, SAYS DISSENTING OPINION

Chief Justice W. H. Fish and Associate Justice Marcus Beck File Dissenting Opinion in Frank Case

DALTON'S TESTIMONY IS PLACED IN SAME CLASS

Opinion Declares That Acts of Defendant With Others Than Slain Girl Prior to Killing, Inadmissible

The dissenting opinion of Chief Justice Fish and Justice Beck covered thirty-three pages and dealt almost exclusively with the testimony of Jim Conley and Dalton. The testimony of Jim Conley and Dalton was irrelevant, immaterial and prejudicial, and therefore was inadmissible.

SUPREME COURT HOLDS A NEW TRIAL WAS GIVEN DEFENDANT BY ROAN

Chief Justice Fish and Associate Justice Beck Dissent, Giving Their Belief That the Testimony of Jim Conley and Dalton Was Irrelevant, Immaterial and Prejudicial and Therefore Inadmissible

STATE HAS RIGHT TO ASK CERTAIN QUESTIONS CONCERNING DEFENDANT'S CHARACTER. IS HELD

Justices Atkinson, Evans, Lumpkin and Hill in Assenting Opinion Hold That Conley Had Right to Explain Remark Which He Attributed to Frank by Relating Previous Transactions of the Accused Known to Conley

THE supreme court of Georgia, with two justices dissenting, Tuesday affirmed the Fulton superior court's verdict of guilty in the case of Leo M. Frank, convicted of the murder of Mary Phagan.

The dissenting justices, Chief Justice Fish and Justice Beck, based upon the theory that the superior court erred in admitting the testimony of James Conley and O. S. Dalton by the effect that Frank had met women at the factory for an extended period before the date of Mary Phagan's murder.

Evidence Supports the Verdict.

The evidence supports the verdict and there was no abuse of discretion in refusing a new trial. The evidence presented in the case is approximately 85,000 words in 149 pages, 85 of which are used in the dissenting opinion.

Disorder in Court Not Sufficient.

The alleged disorder in the court room during the trial, and the verdict was rendered, was not of such a character as to warrant the granting of a new trial, the supreme court held, and the opinion also holds that Judge L. S. Roan, the trial judge, was right in overruling the motion for a new trial on the ground that the jurors were prejudiced against the defendant before the trial.

Head Notes of Opinion from the Supreme Court

The head notes of the decision in the Frank case read as follows: "On the trial of one accused of the murder of a young girl in a factory building of which he was superintendent, where circumstances indicated the murder was committed, it was held that the defendant's guilt is not sufficient cause for a new trial under the special facts of the case that the state was permitted to prove the defendant's night watchman of the factory and also that the accused on the morning after the discovery of the body."

Court Did Not Err in Admitting Conley's Evidence

He also testified to certain remarks given by the accused to him while watching. Held, that it was competent to show by the witness how he had been watching for the accused on previous Saturdays, and that he did watch the door when the girl was taken to the office of the accused; that he heard her scream; that subsequently the accused called on him to assist in removing the body of the deceased.

The assembly marked the first state funeral held in the United States since the war. It was the first time that the body of a state legislator was taken to the state capital for a public funeral. The body of the late Senator Bacon was taken to the state capital at Atlanta on Wednesday afternoon and will lie in state here throughout the afternoon.

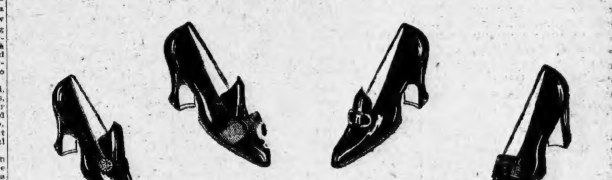

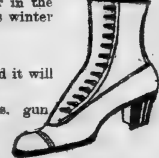

Great Chance For Youngsters Coming Season

The Fact That Many Big Leaguers Have Jumped to the Federal Opportunities for Recruits Going Up to Major Leagues

CHICAGO, Feb. 17.—The season of 1914 will be a good one for young ball players. The prospects for the youngsters in the next race have been doubted because of the severity of the winter brought about by the advent of the outlaw league. The success or failure of the Federal organization will have nothing to do with the opportunities offered to the youngsters in the big leagues now, for the youngsters have signed their contracts with the clubs of organized ball and will have a preference over the older players even if the outlaws do not start the season and all of the players they have on their list apply for admission to the ranks of organized ball.

Now comes the Federal league, and it adds to the price of players so that several of the old-time stars have been moved from the market of the big leagues. The signing of new players to make up an extra league has caused a tight market for the youngsters, and as a result the youngsters are to have a much longer field for the coming season. On the Cub team Bridwell has been removed from the roster and his job at short will lead with one of four or five other youngsters. Keating, Pielan, Motwicz or Bronkie, all of whom will try for the place. No matter which one of the new boys comes out, it will make the Cub infield a much stronger combination than last year. Every one of the candidates can cover the ground on the club and a third faster than Bridwell did last year.

On the south side there are to be two positions for youngsters. The second base and third base positions are open for competition, and the youngsters have a chance of capturing a regular position, but they will have to show real ability before they can crowd up the men that filled the last year.
