Redeeming Our Foreign Policy.

The action of the Senate in rejecting all amondments to the general arbitration treatics, with Great Britain, Japan and its other nations is breadly and deeply significant. It presuges, for one thing, the repeal of the Canal act clause which unjustly exempts American construies shipping from canal folls. It smooths the way to an adjustment of grave issues that involve the republic's honor. It is an important step toward pursing our foreign policy of the world's gathering sumpicion and distrust.

The debate over these treatige hinged on the question of witholding from arbitration such issues as immigrant rights and canal tolls exemption, the late being the cruz of the controvers. By approving the treaties in their original form, the Senate has placed itself squarsly behind the President. Its vote in a test of the opposition's strength and a forecast of what will be done when the specific issue of free tolls comes up for determination. The treaties, among them one with Great Britain, were ratified by a two which am alority. The question of toils is thus made subject to arbitration. There is no likelihood, however, that arbitration will be necessary, for, the Senate's attitude toward the treaties clearly signifies its readiness to repeal the exemption clause of the Canal act; and all indications point to the same action by the House.

We are happily free from entangling alliances, but we are none the less bound to consider the rights and interests of other Powers at all points where they quest only one of the properties and extremely entails an obligation of fairness and considerateness toward others.
