THE renaissance of old Oglethorpe university has begun. Some day at no distant time Atlanta will thrill to hear the breath of a new life return to that which was stifled.

It will be the life of a great university, dedicated to future generations on the traditions of those that are gone; consecrated to a broad and glorious work among the youth of the land—a university that will stir pride in the breast of Dixie and reflect honor upon Atlanta, its home.

Police Board's Committee Will

SHALL THEN DETERMINE

Accused May Be Released by

fore Recorder

A special committee on the board of police commissioners, recently appointed to study the reasons for the increase of arrests in Atlanta, is going to recommend at the next meeting the appointment of an inspector, whose sole duty will be to investigate and give the number of police court cases.

Commissioners Fain, Versey and Collier suggested the special committee and they are unanimous in agreeing that every effort should be made to decrease the number of cases in Atlanta.

The method of procedure to be recommended by the committee is the naming of an inspector who will remain on duty at headquarters and listen to the story of every man sent there. The arresting officer will not report by telephone to the inspector, who after hearing both sides will determine whether or not the case is serious enough to be brought before the recorder.

The inspector will be vested with full power to release the man "sent in" if he has listened to the statement of the accused and given the case any further investigation which he thinks it demands.

SECRET INVESTIGATION FIRST

Until after the inspector has made his report, the police court will not be placed under arrest will not be taken to the police court. This will result simply on a blotter.

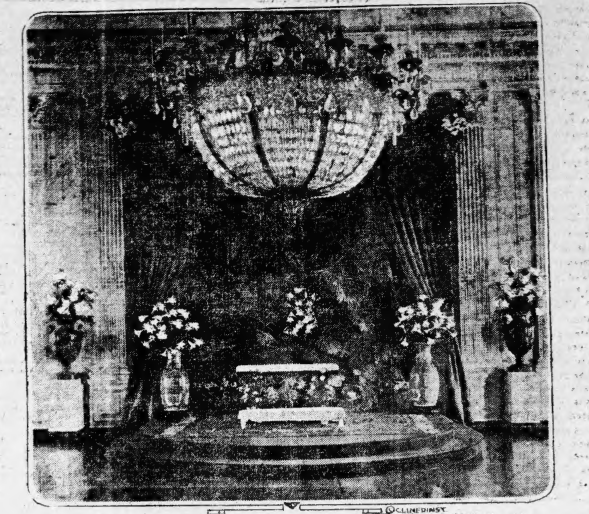

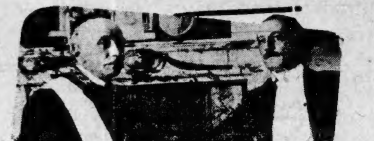
