



In opening the Senate debate on the banking and currency bill Senator Owen emphasized the significant fact that the difference to be adjusted have to do mainly with matters of detail, while the basely of the principles of the pending measure are atmost unant-monaly approved. There is no vital point at which Democrate or Republicans are irreconcilable. Both parties are finally agreed upon the chief purposes in view, in tix general scope, the Administration's plan has been accepted by all interests.

This is an inestimable gain for the cause of currency and banking, reform, although the bill itself will not be perfected and passed as soon as its friends had hoped. Within the past air months more has been accomplished toward the solution of this great problem than during decades before. This is the first time, indeed, that any definite and fruitful step has been taken to rehabilitate our outworn banking and currency system and fill it to the country's present day public steeds. Eitherto every auggestion of reform has around hopeless bide-ring of distrust. Not until now there has been a common path they could all pursue. It is a rully wonderful triumph for the Administration that under its leadership this confusing wilderness has been left behind and the straight highroad to sure results has been reached.
