COUNCIL IN KISS ROW MAKING MASON ELIGIBLE

Ordinance Will Be Introduced
Next Monday, With Pros-
pect of Mayor's Veto
An ordinance repealing the term limit for members of the board of public commissioners will be introduced at the meeting of the council next Monday afternoon by Alderman J. R. Nutting. Such an ordinance, if adopted, will make Chairman Carlos H. Mason eligible to succeed himself for a third term. It was introduced in the Journal of Monday that Mr. Mason's friends in council would institute such legislation.
"The ordinance will be passed by the council," declared Alderman Nutting. "It will very probably be vetoed by Mayor Woodward, but I feel confident that we can get the necessary two-thirds vote to override his veto."
Mayor Woodward has declared that if such an ordinance is sent to him that he will not only veto it, but that he will write a message to council in which he will set forth the reasons for his refusal to sign it.
In announcing his intention to introduce the ordinance, Alderman Nutting stated that it was not offered in the interest of any particular candidate, but that it was for the purpose of putting the police board on the same level as other city boards.
Members of these other boards, he said, are permitted to succeed themselves as often as they can be re-elected. Alderman Nutting declared that the council would not occur until next spring and, therefore, it was impossible at this time to anticipate the candidates.
From 1904 to 1910 the ordinance prohibiting the council from electing members to Chairman Mason and it was provided that members of the board might succeed themselves for one term only. It is now proposed to amend the amended ordinance and to remove all restrictions as to term.

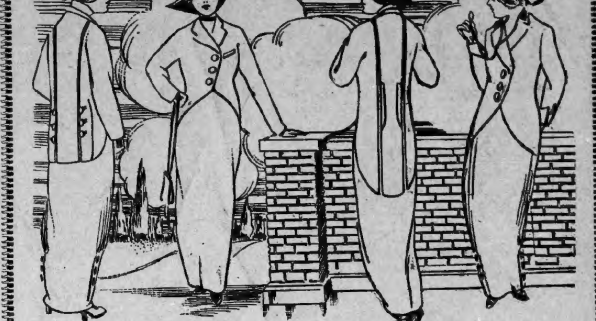

The Jewish New Year begins Wednesday at sundown, and the Atlanta members of that faith will celebrate the occasion by services in all of their synagogues. It will be the beginning of the year 5715 of the Jewish calendar. The services will consist of the blowing of the ram's horn from the steps of the several synagogues.
