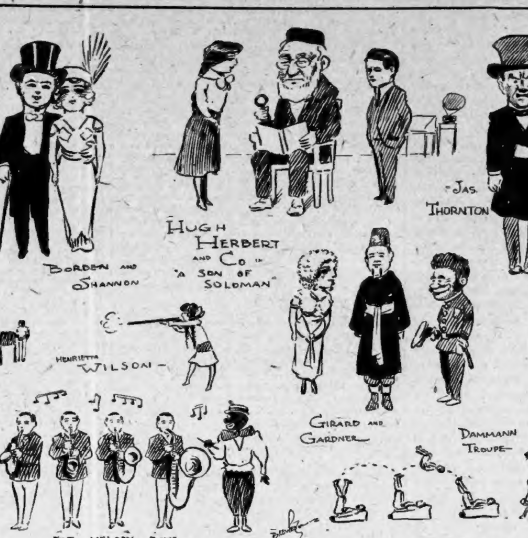

INSURANCE DECISION ATTRACTING ATTENTION

Holding of Supreme Court in Case of Mulker vs. Columbia Life Interesting

The recent holding of the supreme court in the case of Mrs. Julia Mulker against the Columbia National Life Insurance company that it (the supreme court) has no jurisdiction in a case, which have been passed upon by the court of appeals, is attracting the attention of the attorneys over the state.

The Mulker case was carried up from the city court to the court of appeals, which on July held that the widow could recover the amount of an insurance policy, \$10,000, on the death of her husband, despite the protest of the insurance company that the holder of the policy gave a note, which matured before his death and was not paid for himself.

The court of appeals held that the contract for which the note was given in payment, was not a contract for the purchase of insurance, and that the insurance company was not bound to pay the note.
