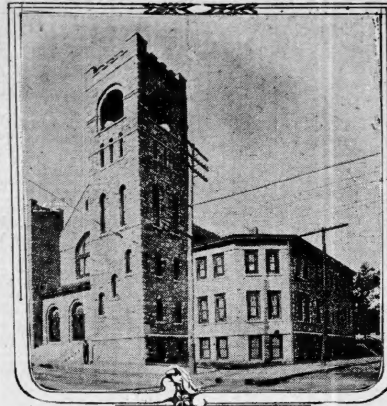

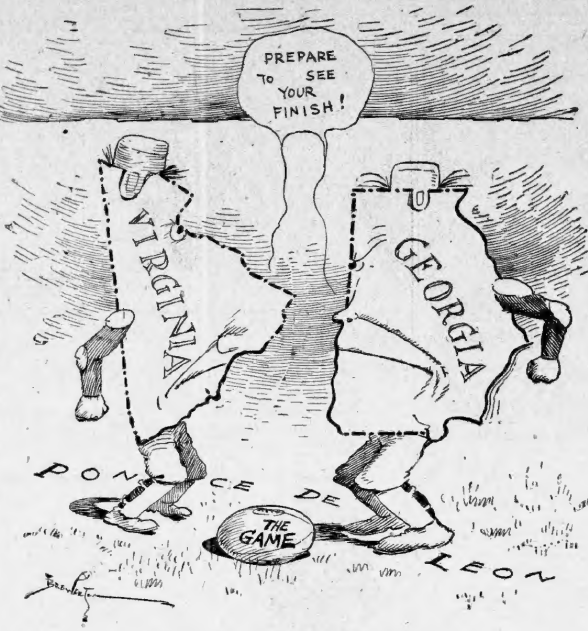

HELPFUL HINTS FOR PIGS IN FA'S

A Football Coach Explains How To Follow What's Happening

BY JAMES MOORE.

The team that wins the choice of receiving or kicking off will not have the choice of game. Don't forget that the right halfback and an All-South-Carter playing right guard will decide the destiny of the Georgia. The following are a few hints as to what you will most likely be impressed and that they are few in number.

If the team kicking off has to kick off twice before the ball is out in play it means that the kicking team were off.

If you see a man on the offense hold the ball in the air, it means that the referee will penalize the offense for that man's unreasonable disposition—if the referee sees it.

If any player seems to be too anxious to get into the play and therefore starts off before the rest of the players, you will know that his team will have to pay the extent of five yards or hard-sacked ground.

If you see a heavy arm reach back in the best of the fray, and the Olin kick another player, look out for something big. First you will see a new player run on the field, next you will see the ball carried half the distance to the opposing team's goal line, and then the sweating player get out of touch, maybe a show, and possibly a championship.

When the ball is thrown forward and forward pass and counts as a down and still in the possession of the team that made the pass.

There are many ways to be penalized outside of these, which are the most common.

The points count as follows:
If a touchdown is made, counts six points, while the goal if kicked will count three points.

If a goal is kicked from the field it counts three for the offensive team. A placement kick counts the same thing as a field goal.
