

Unofficial returns from the special Congressional election held Monday in the Third district of Maine give the Republican candidate a plurality of New Idan wix hundred in a tofal of some thirty-six thousand votes. In the regular Congressional election last year the Republican candidate in this district received a majority, of more than seven hundred votes. These figures candid reasonably be construed as a rebuke to national Democratic policies. They show that a district normally Republican has remained so but beyond that they carry no particular significance. Certainly, they do not indicate any break in the Democratic ranks; for, in the Presidential election last autumn Mr. Wilson received fourteen thousand six hundred and ninety-two votes in this district, while in Monday's election the Democratic candidate for Congress received upwards of fourteen thousand five hundred.

Perhaps the most interestling result of the day was the heavy decrease evidenced in the so-called "Progressive" ballot. The Bull Moose candidate polied only some strety-five hundred votes as compared with o'er thirteen thousand cast for Roosevelt in the Presidential election in 1212, a failing-off innore than fifty per cent. This record would seem at least to samily that the new party has not held its own in Maine despite to exertions of the "Progressive" leaders in that state.

Ererybody except habitual trouble hunters has ceased worrying over what was lately termed the Mexican "crists". The Jitgoes of this country, few from the outset, finding that no one would dance to their wild piping, have dispersed. There is no more babble of intervention. The dollar-mark particles who would have runbed the nation into war merely to protect or promote their financial interests across the border have been effectually silenced. The President's sober words rang an instant and unvaried response both from Congress and the people. In Mexico itself, conditions Lave grown distinctly assuring. Some further has evidently undergone a happy change of mind, if not of heart. He no longer blusters windy threats against American diplomacy nor smirks in self-satisfaction. If all reports be true, and certainly they are credible, Huerta is ready to rettre in accordance with the friendity, yet firm, suggestions of the United States; and when he is out of the way, the Mexican problem will be more than half solved.

The elimination of Huerta from the future poli-

and way, the success problem will be more than all solved. The elimination, of Huerta from the future politics of Mexico, or rather from the forthcoming Presidential election, is one of the essential demands of our Government's policy. No regime of which he is the head will receive the recognition of the United States, nor will it command the support of any considerable portion of the Mexican people. His defacts government was set up in deflance of law and by methods which have no place in the civilization of the control of t

world. There can be no peace in Mexico, no stability or progress until Huerta and his criminal associations are removed.

It has taken the would-be dictator a long time to realize that he could not wheedle or force the United States into countenancing his usurpation; but at length the truth has scaked in. He has had his final word from Washington. He understands that no Mexican government can prevail at this time without the moral sanction of the United States. His treasure is bankrupt and he can secure no leans. His soldiers are mutinous. His personal adherents have, in notable instances, cooled and fallen away. The sentiment of Latin America is against him. The pinch of necessity grows tighter and sharper, forcing Huerta to terms.

It is generally understood, indeed, that he has virtually acceded to the requests of our Government. Under the provisions of the Mexican constitution he is barred from a candidacy in the approaching election and he has tacitly indicated that he will not be a candidate. In that event, the crux of the present Mexican problem will be solved, the provocation of the war the revolutionists have waged will be removed.

of the war the revolutionists have waged will be removed.

A special election to choose a constitutional successor to the late President Madero is set for next October. The government established through that election will be recognized by the United States, a fact which will go very far toward assuring its stability. That does not mean, of course, that peace and order will at once be restored, for, the ills that have besieged Mexico for generations will require years of patience and firmmense for a complete cure. It is not too much to hope, however, that a government created under the constitution by a majority of the Mexican people and morally supported by the United States and the world will gradually order out the present chaos and open the way for a new and better era in that troubled republic.
