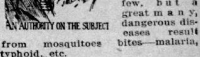

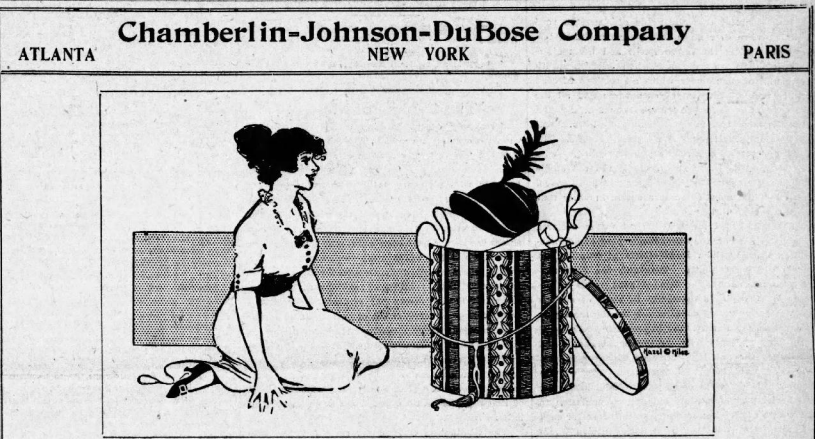

In Vain Platoons of Blue Barred Street—Auto With Wounded Lad Got Through

Police are searching Tuesday for James Conklin, accused of stabbing and seriously wounding Grady Nunnally, twenty-two years old, of 286 Whitehall street, Monday at midnight. An order to arrest him on sight was read to the policeman of the morning and day yesterday.

A wild dash in an automobile from Mitchell and Forsyth streets, the scene of the affair, to the Grady hospital, ended in saving the life of the youth. C. Allan, the young chauffeur, first drove the car in the fast trip, discharging the request to stop at the station of officers who attempted to bar his way at Forsyth street.

Police have been unable to get a coherent account of the driving from witnesses. Chief of Detectives Lanford began an investigation immediately by detaining two men on the case at 8 o'clock Tuesday morning.

Conklin's address is unknown to the police. A statement made by the wounded youth on the operating table at the Grady hospital was to the effect that an altercation which followed a minor dispute Conklin drew his knife and plunged it into the breast of Nunnally.

After the cutting Nunnally lay on the sidewalk at Mitchell and Forsyth street, for several minutes while passers-by looked on for an ambulance. The Grady hospital conveyance was out on another errand, and Nunnally, who was apparently unconscious, was carried to the hospital.

His arm wide open, he drew his car to the hospital. At the Grady hospital, the police met the morning watch patrolmen marching up Decatur from Westchester. The three-score patrolmen, not knowing there was a wounded man in the hospital, ran into the street and commanded him to stop. Without descending his speed he dashed through the station of officers, attracted by the noise of the siren lined up across the street frontably, but he tore through the station without checking.

At the hospital "Tuesday" morning it was announced that Nunnally's condition was dangerous. The consequences might have been more severe had he not been brought to the fast ride to the hospital.

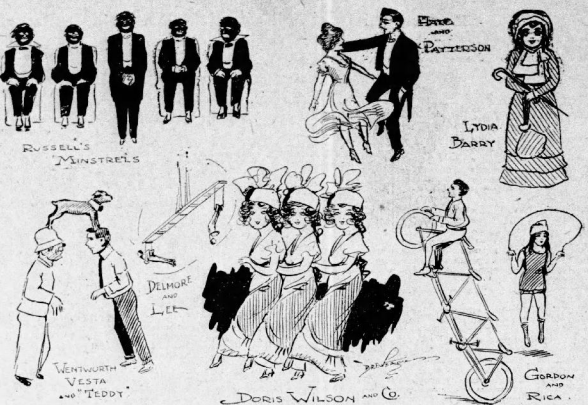

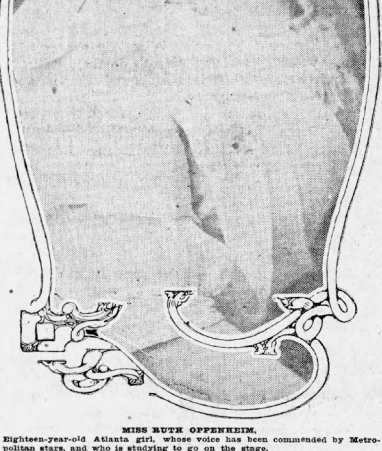

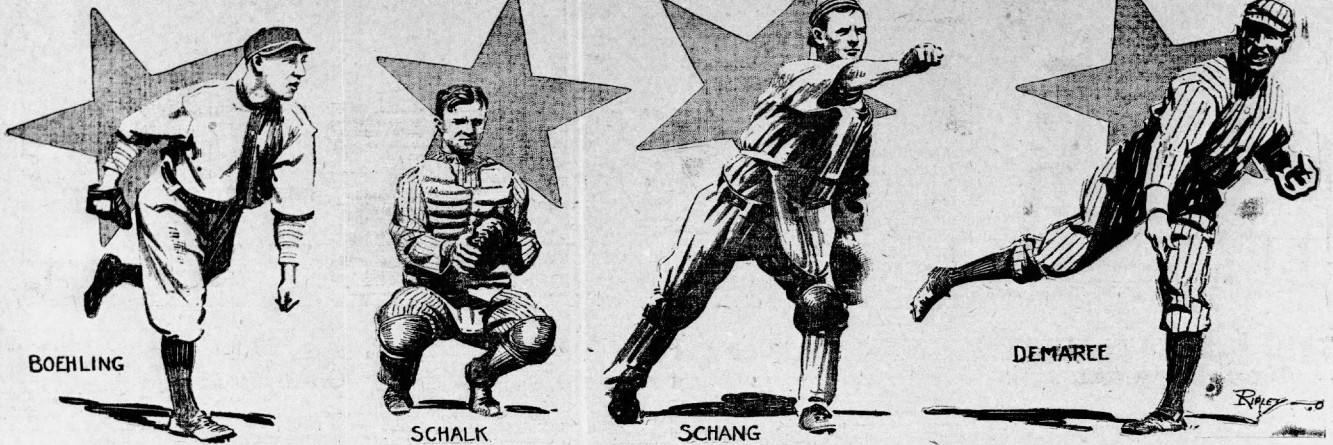
