

AGED BAILIFF WEEPS HE FACES MURDER CHARGE

Robert L. Willis, of Columbus, Denied Bail—Awaits Grand Jury Action

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) COLUMBUS, Ga., Sept. 20—Robert L. Willis, the aged bailiff, who shot and killed Luther Hawkins, a young man, while the latter was trying to elude arrest on the charge of skipping a bond bill of \$5 cents on the afternoon of August 29, must answer to the Muscogee county grand jury for the charge of murder. He is expected to be called to court for a preliminary hearing on Tuesday. The murder of Hawkins took place at the home of the latter in Columbus on August 29. Willis was introduced to both the defense and the state.

Every inch of ground was contested, but as the case was being heard before a final trial jury, and the lawyers engaged in a number of spirited conferences over the admission of certain evidence. The murder of Hawkins is the defense was that the officer accidentally killed the young man while he was trying to get away from him in an effort to stop Hawkins as he was being arrested.

When the decision of the court was announced the prisoner fully realized, possibly for the first time, that he really faced the charge of cold blooded murder, and the fact that he had been arrested and was being held in the city jail to await the action of the grand jury.

Willis has been serving a county jail for a number of years. He is now nearly seventy years of age and is the bailiff of Governor Willis. His case will be taken up at the regular November term of the Muscogee superior court.

He is known in St. Louis chiefly for having squandered a million-dollar inheritance and for his numerous matrimonial affairs. He eloped with the first three St. Louis girls and later was said to have married a fourth.
