
Says Braselton is Talking About a Business Administration and Is Not **Even a Registered Voter** To the People of Atlanta:

Up to this time, as a candidate for Alderman from the Fourth Ward, I have refrained from personalities with reference to my op-ponent, Mr. Amos W. Braselton. It is not now my intention to criticise him personally. But insamuch as he saw fit to make the remark in this morn-ing's Constitution that my supporters are the "ring politicians" and "petty politicians" or words to that effect, I feel justified in calling the public's attention to two facts. has not paid his City taxes for 1912, there now being a Fi-Fa against office.
